Schedule Your Garage Sale

It's time to plan your garage sale and sell your stuff to someone else! Residents must register with the Clerk's office by calling 847-671-8242, by visiting the Clerk's Office at Village Hall or via our website at vofp.com, one week prior to the sale. There is no cost to register. A garage or yard sale sign can only be placed on your property. Sales can be held for a maximum of 30 hours within a three day period. Sale hours cannot be earlier than 8 AM and must end by 7 PM. There is a limit of 2 garage sales per year per address.






The Village is accepting applications now for the Senior Grass Cutting Program, which will run from April until the end of October. Qualified seniors will pay \$10 per cut. Applications are being mailed to past participants. New applicants should go to Village Hall or call 847-671-8240. If you have previously been on the grass or snow program and your health condition has not changed, you will not need to send in a new doctor's note, but will need to submit an application. You must be living on the premises to qualify. Space is limited, apply early.

Yard Waste and Street Sweeping Begins

Place yard waste in brown biodegradable bags and put out on garbage day with your recycling. Purchase bags at local grocery and hardware stores. Residents can select alternatives to bagging yard waste such as mulching mowers, leaf shredders or backyard compost piles to help you and the Village to save money!

Quiet Zone Update

The Village has received verbal notification that we have been approved for a \$1.1 million Pedestrian Rail Safety Grant! The grant will fund a significant portion of the safety improvements needed at the pedestrian crossing at the Calwagner and 25th Street grade crossing and at the Metra Station. Next, we will be working with Metra to design and construct the safety improvements. The Village will make street improvements including installing a median barrier at 25th and Ruby.

Understanding Your Water, Sewer and Garbage Fee

Last month all account holders saw a \$5 processing fee included on their water, sewer and garbage bill. Many of you had questions about what this fee covers and why it was necessary. This fee covers the various costs related to processing the monthly water bills as well as printing and mailing the bills and newsletter to all businesses and households.

It is also important to note that the processing fee covers the administrative staffing costs required to produce a monthly reading which includes data input, verifying and maintaining residential and business accounts, managing and updating billing software, tracking and billing late fees to delinquent accounts and conducting hearings for users who need payment plans established. Also, Village personnel spend a considerable amount of time on the collection process for delinquent accounts including producing and mailing late notice letters, door tagging, sending shut off letters, shutting off water and sending accounts to a collection agency.

In addition, the staff monitors and reviews accounts regularly to identify unusual spikes in water consumption and notifies users that a possible leak has been detected on the property. Often, this requires a site visit and assistance in locating a service provider to fix the plumbing problem.

Staff time is also spent on garbage billing each month as well as time to verify that garbage is removed by various haulers and department personnel in a proper and timely manner.

This processing fee does not establish any new revenue for the Village. It does help defray some of the cost in order for the Village to provide free monthly garbage service to our senior citizens.

IEPA Loans to Fund Large Multi-Year Infrastructure Project

The Village is in the process of applying for two low interest loans from the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency (IEPA) which are available to qualified municipalities to support improving their water and sewer systems. The loans would allow the Village to continue to fund much needed improvements in the Reuter Sub-division, including replacing sewer and water mains and increasing storm-water capacity to help direct urban flooding to the streets.

Currently the Village does not generate enough revenue from water and sewer sales to demonstrate the ability to pay The mammoth infrastructure back the loans. Water usage has decreased by at least 20%, project is expected to take place over a seven to ten year primarily as a result of large industrial users using innovative period, is estimated to cost \$10 to \$14 million and will cooling techniques that require using less water. In order to qualify for the loans, the Village will be instituting a 15% increase in water and sewer rates effective with May water bills.
