Village Starts Leaf Pick-up Service

Residents are reminded to place leaves in brown biodegradable bags only and place them near your trash and recycling for pick-up. Bags can be purchased at local grocery and hardware stores. Leaves cannot be picked-up if they are placed in plastic bags or in the street.

Do not put or blow leaves into the street. It clogs the street sweepers and sewers and causes unnecessary flooding and maintenance costs. Also, remember that burning leaves is not permitted in Franklin Park.

Consider mulching your leaves to sprinkle over plants and shrubs to help retain water and to protect them over the winter months. You can also skip the raking and simply mow over your leaves a few times and leave them on your lawn to add nutrients and provide protection from winter weather!

The Department of Public Works will sweep Village curbs through late November. Please check signs on your block for parking restrictions. For more information, call 847-671-8252.

Crystal Creek Letter of Map **Revision Approved**

The Village is pleased to announce that the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) accepted the flood insurance study and Letter of Map Revision (LOMR) application sponsored jointly by the Villages of Franklin Park and Schiller Park. The effective date of the LOMR is December 7, 2018. This date allows for a 90 day public comment period, followed by a 30 day period for FEMA to evaluate and respond to any public comments received. A copy of the FEMA cover letter, approved LOMR determination, revised flood zone maps, flood insurance study profiles and tables are included in a PDF format on our website at vofp.com.

Please note that the effective date of the map must pass before this map can be utilized for changes to mortgage agreements and flood insurance policies. In the meantime, the Village recommends that home owners keep their flood insurance policies up to date if required by the terms of their mortgage agreements. If you have questions regarding the appropriate level of flood insurance required, contact your flood insurance broker.
