#### Garbage, Recycling, Yard Waste, Bulk Item and Branch Collection

Garbage and recycling will continue to be collected every Monday by Republic Services. Garbage and recycling must be placed in their respective carts.

Republic Services has begun yard waste removal and bulk item pick-up. Place yard waste in biodegradable bags where you put your garbage for removal. Also, instead of bagging waste, please consider mulching yard waste to support plant growth. Grass clippings can be used as fertilizer to nourish lawns. Simply mow over the clippings and leave them on the lawn. This option saves on the cost to remove the yard waste bags.



Due to the health crisis causing a reduction in staff availability, the Village has suspended branch pick-up and will only collect branches in emergency situations including storm related situations. # Easing the Financial Impact of Covid-19

In April, the Board of Trustees unanimously approved two Executive Orders I signed to limit face-to-face contact, to facilitate social distancing and to alleviate the financial impact of COVID-19 on our residents and businesses.

Specifically, these actions have allowed the Village to extend bill payment deadlines, suspend service disconnections, cancel late fees, and extend renewal dates for vehicle stickers and for permits. You will find the details of these Executive Orders on Page 2 of this newsletter. It is our hope that by enacting these measures, the Village will relieve some of the financial stress caused by this crisis.

#### Protecting the Health of Our Community

Please continue to do your part to adhere to the Governor's 'Stay at Home' order which has been extended through May 30. I recognize it is more difficult to do so as the weather gets warmer. Staying home and practicing social distancing will keep you and your family safe and healthy. Frequent hand washing, avoiding touching surfaces in public places, wearing gloves and masks are steps we must all take to preserve the public health.

#### **Executive Orders Assist Residents and Businesses**

The Village Board has taken steps to ease the stress that the Covid-19 pandemic has placed on Franklin Park residents and businesses. The Village has instituted the following measures:

- The March 27, April 28, and May 27 water, sewer and garbage bill payment deadlines are extended to June 15. Delinquent charges or late fees for Village water, sewer and garbage service are suspended through June 15.
- **Service disconnections** for Village water, sewer and garbage service and water meter replacements are suspended through June 15.
- Street sweeping parking tickets will not be issued until **June 1** and there will be no vehicle seizure for delinquent parking tickets until after June 1.
- Village Vehicle Stickers, due to expire June 30, will be valid until July 31. No late fee or penalty will be imposed through July 31. Residents will also be able to purchase a new vehicle sticker at the regular price until July 31.
- Registration for Garage or Yard Sales shall not be permitted until June 1. No application for a Block or Yard Party shall be processed or permitted until June 1. These actions were taken to slow down person-to-person contact within the Village.

#### Village Events Update

In order to prioritize the health and safety of our residents, the Village is following State guidelines and recommendations for adhering to social distancing at public events and gatherings. As a result, the Village's annual **Memorial Day Observance** has been cancelled and the annual **Franklin Park Fest featuring Railroad Day** will be postponed to a future date.

Please watch the Village website for updates regarding other events and services impacted by the COVID-19 pandemic.

- Building permits are still being processed. Building permit expiration dates may be extended for ninety (90) days, upon written request, and the fees for extensions are suspended. License renewal applications are extended until June 1 unless required for health and safety reasons.
- Administrative adjudication of red-light camera tickets set to be heard on March 19, April 16 and May 21 are continued to June 18. No additional fees or penalties shall be assessed on violations due to this continuance.
- Administrative adjudication of all other Village ordinance violations and building code violations set to be heard on March 19, April 16 and May 21 are continued to June 18. No additional fees or penalties will be assessed due to this continuance.
- Valid liquor licenses and business licenses will be extended from April 30 to June 1. The application and license fee due for the renewal of a license will be extended to June 1.
- The commuter parking monthly permit for April and May shall be refunded to an applicable permit holder upon request.

# How to Wear a Cloth Face Covering

Governor Pritzker has issued an Executive Order requiring people to wear a face covering or mask when in a public space where they can't maintain a six-foot distance from other people. The Illinois Department of Public Health has issued the following important guidelines for face coverings. Face masks should:

- fit snugly but comfortably against the side of the face
- be secured with ties or ear loops
- include multiple layers of fabric
- allow for breathing without restriction
- be able to be laundered and machine dried without damage or change to shape

As a reminder, do not put a face mask on children under the age of 2 years old. Please do not use surgical masks or other personal protective equipment (PPE) intended for health care workers.
