Vaccine Clinic Provided by Osco Drugs

Get your flu, pneumonia and Covid booster vaccines!

No appointment is necessary! But remember to bring your Medicare card or insurance information and your CDC vaccination card. Covid booster shots are free with Medicare and most private insurance but are no longer free to the uninsured.

The Franklin Park Manila Lions Club will host a mobile van on site that will provide free vision and hearing tests from 9 AM until 11 AM only.

Athletico will provide fall prevention, posture, and exercise information. They will also provide physical therapy assessments if you show your commercial PPO insurance card. (PT assessments are not covered by Medicare or Medicaid).

Bring unused and expired medications for safe disposal.

Free blood pressure checks.

Register to vote.

Area elected officials, Leyden Family Services, Leyden Township, and other local agencies including the Cook County Sheriff's Office and healthcare providers will also have staff available to answer your questions and provide information about services and programs that are specifically designed to help older adults.

National Fire Prevention Week October 8-14

• Keep the cooking area free of flammable items and remove dish towels, oven mitts, food packaging, and paper towels out of the area.

• Turn pot handles toward the back of the stove. Keep a lid nearby when cooking. If a grease fire starts, slide the lid over the pan and turn off the burner.

• Create a "child and pet free zone" of at least three feet around the cooking area and anywhere hot food or drink is prepared or carried.

Leaf Pickup and Yard Waste Removal Information

Leaf and yard waste removal service will continue through the first week of December. Leaves must be placed in brown biodegradable bags or in the Yard Waste container from Republic Services. Put your container or biodegradable bags out for pickup on Tuesdays. Leaves will not be removed if they are in plastic bags or placed in the street. Bags can be purchased at local grocery and hardware stores. Do not blow leaves into the street because it damages street sweeper equipment and can clog sewers causing street flooding.

Burning leaves is not permitted. Instead of raking leaves, you can mulch them! Simply mow over the leaves a few times and let them sit on your lawn. The mulched leaves provide nutrients and protection from winter weather. Also, sprinkle over your plants and shrubs to help retain water during winter months. The Department of Public Works will sweep curbs through late November. Check signs on your block for parking restrictions. For more information, call (847) 671-8252.
