Franklin Park Breaks Ground on New Police Station

Mayor Barrett Pedersen, Police Chief Michael Witz and Village Trustees broke ground recently on the new Franklin Park Police Station and were joined by Congressman Michael Quigley and other area elected officials.

"This new facility will help our police department in their efforts to patrol our neighborhoods and will allow them to work toward stopping crime and vandalism before it happens," stated Mayor Pedersen. "I believe it is critical to help those who put their lives on the line for our citizens and that they have all the tools they need to help keep our community safe and well protected."

The new facility was designed to serve the Police Department, and the Village, for the next 50 years and will help officers to deliver high quality law enforcement services to residents and businesses. The new facility will also serve as regional center to allow the Franklin Park Police Department to collaborate with police departments in neighboring communities on area-wide task forces and to implement new crime prevention programs.

"This new facility will support our officers as they work to secure the safety of our neighborhoods and our families every day," stated Police Chief Michael Witz. "The new Police Station will allow us to increase efficiency and to apply best practices in police officer staffing and police procedures, resulting in continuing to provide the highest quality of service to our community."

The Village agreed to build a new Police Station on the former Unilever property at 9451 West Belmont because the current facility was determined to be functionally unproductive and potentially dangerous. The current 15,000 square foot Police Station was constructed in the 1930's and has had at least seven additions. Village officials report that the building has an antiquated electrical system, does not meet building code, has no sprinkler or fire alarm system and is not ADA accessible. The new Police Station will be developed in accordance with safety requirements to help protect police officers and visitors while in the building.



The new facility will also serve as a model for efficiency and sustainability. The 36,500 square foot building will incorporate high performance lighting and energy efficient systems that will help to keep energy costs down. In addition, it will utilize recycled materials in the design and construction of the building to reduce pollutants associated with transportation and fabrication and will include paving materials to reduce flooding.

The new Police Station is expected to be completed by summer of 2013.

Fullerton Avenue Closed

The IDOT bridge project has closed Fullerton Avenue completely to traffic to perform reconstruction of the roadway between Ruby Street and Hawthorne Avenue. This closure will remain in place until the completion of the project. Access from Silver Creek Road and Westbrook Drive will be restricted and only residents affected by the project will be allowed to enter the construction zone to get to their driveways. IDOT will provide temporary driveways to all residents affected.

Trap Neuter Return - Helping to Control Feral Cats

CatVando is working to reduce the number of cats reproducing in our community and to establish a Community Based Trap Neuter Return (TNR) Program in Franklin Park. A TNR Program is the only effective, humane, economical method of caring for these cats while assuring their population doesn't grow. With the cooperation of the Village, it residents, organizations and businesses, CatVando completed 260 TNRs in the first year.

Their goal is to TNR at least 380 cats and will help put Franklin Park on the path to achieving the goal of zero or controlled cat growth. Plan Your Garage Sale Now

Residents must register with the Village to hold a sale at 847-671-8242. There is no cost to register and garage or yard sale signs can only be placed on your property and must be removed by 7 PM the last day of the sale. Sales can be held for a maximum of 30 hours within a three day period. Residents are allowed two garage or yard sales per 12-month period, with at least a 3-month period between the two sales. Sale hours must be no earlier than 8 AM and must end by 7 PM. Signs cannot project higher than six feet above the curb, cannot exceed six square feet in height and cannot be nailed to utility poles or placed on the public right of way.


