Our first duty is to protect our neighborhoods and our families. Thanks to the leadership of our Police Chief Mike Witz, and all the brave men and women who serve with him, and the vigilance of neighbors, we continue to secure our community. We are seeing noticeably less gang activity and a visible reduction in graffiti. Our schools continue to be safe, with very few incidents.

Recently we added another important technological tool to assist in the prevention and detection of crime. Our new surveillance system has a 30 foot mast with three cameras attached, one which has infra-red capabilities. The system has a 24 hour, 7 day a week recording unit and a public Police, dangerous criminals have been removed address system. The unit is designed to work in from our streets. conjunction with the Village's community camera system which is in the second of a four phase

deployment. The mobile camera system is monitored through the Police and Fire 911 center and Police Command Mobile Phones. The system was funded through a grant from the Illinois Law Enforcement Alarm System.

Recently, our Police Department has been working with the FBI and the Chicago Police Department on a Joint Task Force on Gangs, in an effort to stop street violence. 

West Nile Precautions

As temperatures rise, so does the threat of the mosquito-borne West Nile Virus. Residents should take precautions to avoid bites by limiting time outdoors at dawn and dusk, when mosquitoes are most active. Wear long-sleeves, pants and socks, and use insect repellent with 30% DEET, primarily applied to clothing. Eliminate breeding sites by cleaning gutters, storing containers upside down, covering trash containers to keep out rainwater and emptying birdbaths and wading pools every few days. Keep grass and weeds cut short and make sure your screen doors close tightly to prevent mosquitoes from entering.

Dead bird collection is available for testing by calling 847-671-8240 and they can determine if the bird is suitable for testing. Village inspectors are larviciding mosquito pools that are found and reported. Also, backyard catch basins will be treated by Inspectional Services by contacting them at 847-671-8240.

Leyden Family Service Can Help with Medical or Social Security Coverage

Leyden Family Services can help you apply for Social Security, Medicare, Medicaid, SNAP (formally known as food stamps), Circuit Breakers (IL-1363 form), LiHeap (Energy Assistance), Safe Link (Cell phone) and Unemployment and Retirement Benefits (SSA).

You must bring the following documents: Current proof of ALL income for this year (payroll or unemployment stubs, social security award letter, etc.), proof of household expenses (utility bills, medical care, rent/lease, property tax, medication costs, etc.), asset information (savings, checking, bonds, CD's, etc.), property taxes and rent paid (by money orders or checks), a valid Driver's License or State I.D., Social Security Card(s). Senior Assistance Available at Village Hall

A representative from West Suburban Senior Services will be available at Village Hall, on the fourth Thursday of every month beginning on July 26 from 9 AM to Noon to help you complete Circuit Breaker applications. To be eligible, you must be 65 before January 1, 2012 and must live in Illinois. You will need to bring your social security card, proof of 2011 income and proof of rent and property taxes paid in 2011. Income limits are \$27,610 for one and \$36,635 for two people and spouse includes parties to a civil union. For details, call 708-547-5600.
