Not only does the Chicagoland region have some of the world's most respected universities, but Triton College is on the cutting edge of training workers for 21st century jobs, and Leyden High Schools are leading our region in career development curriculum. Our Community and Economic Development staff and the businesses leaders on our Economic Development Committee work closely with both these institutions with the goal

Our Village is Financially Sound

In order to continue to attract business and revitalize our infrastructure, Franklin Park has made great strides to remain fiscally strong and financially sound.

We have employed a business approach to operations, continually reevaluating our systems, streamlining our operations, and ensuring that we are cost-efficient and responsible with taxpayer dollars. The Board and staff also work together to think outside of the box; finding innovative ways to fund infrastructure repairs without increasing the property tax burden on our residents or businesses.

All funds generated from our Non-Home Rule Sales Tax are pledged to upgrading our streets. We have earmarked water fees to revitalize water, sewer and

Anticipated Construction Timeline for EOWA Projects in Franklin Park

2016 Construction of 4 detention basins to reduce flooding

2017 New storm sewers, utilities and roadways along King St. (Powell St. to Wolf Rd.), Addison Ave. (Acorn Ln. to Wolf Rd.) and Wolf Rd. (King St. to Addison Ave.)

2017 – 2018 Taft Avenue Extension

2017 – 2020 Franklin Avenue from County Line Road to Wolf Road

2018 – 2020 I-294 to Franklin Avenue/Green Street Interchange



The Illinois Tollway recently held an Open House to inform residents and businesses about the Elgin O'Hare Western Access (EOWA) Project and Mayor Barrett Pedersen highlighted the related improvements for Franklin Park.

Update Elgin O'Hare Western Access (EOWA) Project

The Illinois Tollway Authority held an open house on July 17th to provide an update to the community on the Elgin O'Hare Western Access (EOWA) Project. Businesses, property owners and residents were able to ask questions about the improvements and timeline for future improvements in Franklin Park. Local improvements will include direct access to I-294 by way of a new interchange at Franklin Avenue and a new Taft Avenue overpass connecting Franklin Avenue to Irving Park Road, which will connect the west industrial corridor directly to the O'Hare South Cargo Area.

Franklin Park's industrial area located north of I-294 experiences recurring flooding in moderate to severe storm events. The Village is coordinating with the Illinois Tollway to address these storm water issues through the EOWA Project. The improvements, including 4 detention basins and new storm sewers, are designed to increase the level of flood protection for the area.

Street and Infrastructure Improvements Move Ahead

Street and utility improvements are in full swing in the Cullerton Industrial Area which will include street reconstruction, sewer and drainage work and increased roadway access for area companies. Additionally, the Cullerton Industrial Area and West Mannheim Residential Area (WMRA) will soon have aging water mains replaced. Later this summer, construction will begin to widen streets north and south bound streets in the WMRA Area to facilitate more parking and increased access for our emergency vehicles.

Work has begun on Phase III of the Scott Street Basin project, which is in it's second year and will be completed this fall. This project includes new water mains, separation of the combined sewers, new roads, sidewalks, curbs and sanitary service hook-ups within the public right of way. This project will improve Elder from Westbrook to Richard, Hawthorne from Grand to Elder and Wrightwood from Westbrook to Hawthorne.

Be aware that construction for the 2015 Street Improvement Project is underway and could cause traffic delays in the area. Several area streets are being resurfaced and repaired as a result of funds dedicated from the voter approved 2014 referendum to enact a 1% non-home rule sales tax.
