We have partnered with the Village of River Grove and are working together to achieve this status. Unfortunately, it is a somewhat complicated and lengthy process. We have met with, and will continue to meet with, all the approving agencies, or Diagnostic Team, comprised of representatives from the Federal Railroad Administration, the Illinois Commerce Commission, Illinois Department of Transportation, METRA, Canadian Pacific, Canadian National and Indiana Harbor Belt Railroad.

I wanted to update you on the aggressive steps that Franklin Park is taking to secure a 'Quiet Zone' designation for our Village. With multiple rail crossings in Franklin Park and trains traveling through our town all night long, it has become an absolute necessity that we receive consideration as a Quiet Zone. This designation would stop the requirement for trains to use their horns as they approach the grade crossings.

crossing gates at Calwagner. They also suggest extensive safety measures at the Metra pedestrian crossing, which could be expensive.

Conforming to these requirements is extremely expensive. That is why it is so important that we work closely with our partners to share costs, leverage resources and seek grants if available.

Attaining approval is a lengthy process, with considerable expense. But I assure you that obtaining this designation is of the highest priority to me and the Board. We will continue to update you on our progress, in the newsletter and our website.

Franklin Park's Financial Management Makes the Grade! It's A+ Again!

Standard & Poor's Ratings Service has assigned an A+ long term rating to the Village of Franklin Park's 2015 General Obligation (GO) bonds. The agency also reaffirmed the Village of Franklin Park's A+ for previously issued GO Bonds.

The rating underscores the Village's strengthening financial position and allows the Village to pay lower interest rates, lessening the burden on the taxpayer.

The agency noted the Village's on-going efforts at stabilizing its financial position, its sound cash position and the strength of the local economy when assigning the rating.

We are proud that our fiscal discipline and excellent financial practices are paying dividends for our taxpayers.

I thank the Village Board for upholding strong financial principles and our staff for its continued dedication to controlling costs.

Did you know that 70% of all energy is lost between your ceiling and your roof? Want to learn some simple energy efficiency tips to help save you money on your energy costs? Invite friends, family, and neighbors over, and an Energy Impact Illinois program expert and certified contractor will use your home to demonstrate energy efficiency concepts and conduct a simple energy assessment.

Normally, this service costs \$400 or more. For a limited time, an energy assessment is only \$99 for a single family home through Energy Impact Illinois, or you can get it free by hosting a house party!

During the house party, the contractor leads participants through an energy assessment of the host's home, using special tools like blower doors and infrared cameras to point out areas where the homeowner is losing energy and what kind of projects can help them save money. The host doesn't need to provide anything – their only responsibility is to have at least 5 other homeowners attend.
