Franklin Park Moves Forward with Infrastructure Renewal

Over 80% of our residents who are ordinance was based on the recommendations in Tier 1, (those using less than 900 cubic mefrom the Citizen's Advisory Committee on Infrastructure, a nationally recognized consultant and the findings of the Asset Management Report. As we have discussed, the report found that our aging infrastructure requires serious attention and is in danger of failing. It noted the cost to address the severe need for water and sewer repair is approximately \$235 million over the next 30 years. After reviewing the Village's finances, we the Citizen's Advisory Committee concluded that water and sewer rates must be increased to fund the renewal projects as well as to make the Village eligible to apply for grant funding to support infrastructure improvements.

When maintenance is ignored and upgrades are deferred, the problem is only compounded. As an example, by delaying repair of the King Street Water Storage Tanks, it recently cost the Village \$4 million to rehab them. We are actually saving substantial amounts of money by addressing the problems NOW. The problems will only get worse and construction costs will only increase.

Our residents and businesses have indicated they are aware of the urgent need to repair, renew and replace our aging infrastructure. We have found that our community is united in the belief that we need to prioritize our infrastructure improvements and focus our limited resources accordingly.

No one likes a rate increase. But The Citizens Advisory Committee recommended it because

ters of water per month) will see an average increase of approximately \$14 per month for combined water and sewer.

The ordinance includes a provision that holds rates to low income individuals and families essentially flat. Additionally, there is NO increase in property taxes.

Remember, water conservation will help you save money. We will continue to publish tips to help you conserve water. Village's Credit Rating Raised

Standard and Poor's Rating Service has raised the Village's credit rating two full categories to A+. An increased bond rating indicates that the Village's financial condition is continuing to strengthen. It also allows the Village to borrow money, if needed, at a lower rate and allows the Village to refinance to a lower interest rate on any existing debt. Standard and Poor's raised the Village's rating two categories in November 2012 and the August 2014 review resulted in another two-category jump to A+. Finance experts view a two-category upgrade as rare and two consecutive two-category upgrades are considered extremely

Also, for a third year in a row, the Village has been awarded the Certificate of Achievement for Excellence in Financial Reporting by the Government Finance Officers Association. It is the highest form of recognition in government accounting and financial reporting and demonstrates the Village's commitment to improving our budgeting process and applying a rigorous set of standards in our fiscal reporting.

Airplane Noise Hotline

Noise complaints have greatly increased in Franklin Park and in the surrounding communities since last year when O'Hare Airport changed runway patterns. We are working closely with the Chicago Department of Aviation, the O'Hare Noise Compatibility Commission (ONCC) and Congressman Mike Quigley's office to develop short and long term solutions. In order to make critical changes in flight patterns and noise regulations, there must be documented accounts of the negative effects of the new flight configurations.

We urge you to file complaints about noise, low-flying aircraft, frequency of flight operations or vibration of structures to the O'Hare Noise Complaint Hotline at 800-435-9569. Please note the date, time, flight path, aircraft type, and impact. Include your address and contact information. You can file online at the Village website at vofp.com. Look for the blue Report Airplane Noise button on our Homepage. You can report every incident you experience. By letting them know the volume of incidents we can get relief sooner.




Village Seeks Veteran Names for Monument

Leaf Pick-up and Street Sweeping

Autumn has arrived and the leaves are beginning to fall. Residents should place leaves in brown biodegradable bags only and remember to put them out on garbage day with your recycling for pick-up. Bags are available for purchase at local grocery and hardware stores. Leaves cannot be picked-up if they are placed in plastic bags or in the street. Pick-up continues until early December. In addition, yard waste bags will only be picked up through December 5. These dates are established by Allied Waste.







Repairing Vehicles On Village Streets

Repair or maintenance of a vehicle is prohibited by ordinance on residential property, except on a vehicle owned by the occupant. The vehicle must have valid state registration plates and a current Village vehicle sticker indicating that the vehicle is registered at that address. The Village ordinance also states that "No person may repair or maintain a vehicle of others on their residential property whether for compensation or not".
