- 3. Chief Witz stated since the recent snowfall was only a little over 1 inch, the snowfall parking regulations were not in effect. Chief Witz spoke about calls received on New Year's Eve. Chief Witz announced January 9 is National Law Enforcement Appreciation Day. Chief Witz spoke about a drug search warrant that was executed on Chestnut Street and the items recovered. Chief Witz spoke about the two new police officers that will be sworn in if they pass their power test. Chief Witz spoke about two male subjects that were brought in by the Elmhurst police department on December 31 for theft of catalytic converters. They will also be charged with thefts in Franklin Park
- 4. Carmen Cupello spoke about Village Hall's lower roof being approximately 75% completed but 100% water proofed. Mr. Cupello reported the upper roof will probably not be started until late winter or early spring. Mr. Cupello stated some ceiling tiles will be replaced on the first floor of the building
