 - A. FINANCE AND SPECIAL EVENTS COMMITTEE (Mr. Johnson, Chair)
 - 1. MR. JOHNSON THANKED ALL SUPERVISORS AND DEPARTMENT HEADS FOR GETTING THEIR BUDGETS IN. RON HELLER WILL HAVE ALL OF THE BUDGET INFORMATION PUT TOGETHER BY THE END OF THE WEEK FOR THE TRUSTEES TO REVIEW. THE FIRST BUDGET MEETING WILL BE HELD AT THE END OF THE MONTH

VI. STAFF REPORTS AND COMMENTS; DISCUSSION ON AGENDA ITEMS

- 1. Joe Lauro spoke about agenda item #5 regarding the proposal from R. J. Riteway Door Corporation to conduct emergency repairs and replacement of the garage door at the water division building. Mr. Lauro spoke about the overhead door at the salt dome stuck in the up position. Mr. Lauro spoke about former employee from the water/sewer division, Robert Shaw, calling to commend the Fire Department for helping him after he broke his hip. Mr. Lauro reported the primary street routes were cleared of snow before the morning rush hour and the secondary streets were being worked on. The businesses along Grand Avenue have been cleared of snow. Mr. Lauro spoke about his executive assistant handling a lot of calls from seniors, handicapped, and other residents who needed help because of the snow storm. Mr. Lauro commended all Village workers who helped during the snow storm
- 2. Chief Iovinelli spoke about his department digging out and clearing fire hydrants, and Public Works helped to keep them clear. Chief Iovinelli reported extra staff has been used for ambulance calls due to the un-shoveled snow on some sidewalks. Chief Iovinelli announced the St. Baldrick's event will be held on March 6

- 3. Chief Witz reported on a criminal sexual assault of a handicapped person which took place on January 28. Chief Witz spoke about the investigation of a gang-related shooting. Chief Witz spoke about a law going into effect on January 1 that requires all lineups to be videotaped. This will require additional equipment to be installed at the police station
- 4. Dave Talbott announced there will be a Citizens' Meeting on February 9 to discuss prioritization of streets for the upcoming year. There will be another Citizens' Meeting to discuss quiet zones at a later date. Mr. Talbott spoke about agenda item #3 regarding supporting a multi-jurisdictional application for fiscal year 2016-2020 congestion mitigation and air quality funding for key elements of the Elgin-O'Hare/Western Access Transportation project
- 5. Ron Heller spoke about agenda item #4 regarding the issuance of the general obligation refunding bonds. The 2004A bonds are being funded and will save \$47,000 debt service. Mr. Heller spoke about two other refunded bonds from 2014
