- 1. John Schneider spoke about Anytime Fitness moving into the Grand Plaza shopping center with a Domino's Pizza directly next to it. The Domino's Pizza will start out as a delivery or pickup only but will end up having a sit down restaurant, the project was approved unanimously by the Zoning Board of Appeals. Mr. Schneider reported the Grand and Mannheim project is moving along. The department put out an option on two parcels. In the next month or so, Chipotle should be going in along with a T-Mobile. Mr. Schneider spoke about CMAP meeting here this Wednesday and talking about things we would like to see happen in this town. There was a planning session at East Leyden High School where younger residents of town to talked about what they would like to see in our town. Mr. Schneider spoke about the Digital Realty expansion. The building is 100% leased while still under construction
