 - 1. John Schneider stated his department has been working on new zoning for the downtown area for the last 1-1/2 years. Mr. Schneider gave some background information on Ms. Leslie Oberholtzer. Ms. Oberholtzer from Codametrics gave a presentation on the downtown zoning.

 - 1. MR. JOHNSON STATED THERE WILL BE A COMMITTEE OF THE WHOLE MEETING NEXT MONTH FOR FINANCE
 - 2. MR. JOHNSON ANNOUNCED THE VETERANS DAY PROGRAM WILL BE HELD ON NOVEMBER 11, AT 11:00 A.M.

- B. WATER AND SEWER/FLEET MAINTENANCE COMMITTEE (Mr. Ruhl, Chair)
 - 1. MR. RUHL REPORTED ON TWO WATER MAIN BREAKS ON GRAND AVENUE
 - 2. MR. RUHL STATED NINE DRAINS WERE REPAIRED LAST WEEK. EVERYTHING WAS GOING WELL UNTIL THE SEWER TRUCK BROKE DOWN
 - 2. MR. RUHL SPOKE ABOUT THE WATER RATE INCREASE AND HOW THE VILLAGE HAS BEEN RECEIVING A NUMBER OF CALLS FROM RESIDENTS ABOUT THIS. THE WATER DEPARTMENT IS INSPECTING WATER METERS AND HELPING RESIDENTS CHECK FOR WATER LEAKS

 - 2. MR. YBARRA REPORTED ON TREE TRIMMING, BRANCH PICKUP AND LEAVES AND STATED THE RENTED SWEEPER IS WORKING OUT GREAT
 - 3. MR. YBARRA STATED THE PARADE WAS A SUCCESS

 - 1. MS. SPECIAL REPORTED ON TWO GRANTS. ONE OF THE GRANTS IS FOR ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT IN THE AMOUNT OF \$1.3 MILLION. THIS GRANT WILL BE USED TOWARD INFRASTRUCTURE IMPROVEMENTS IN THE CULLERTON INDUSTRIAL AREA. THE SECOND GRANT IS A LOCAL TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE GRANT FROM THE CHICAGO METROPOLITAN AGENCY FOR PLANNING TO CONDUCT A TRUCK-ROUTING INFRASTRUCTURE PLAN
- F. HEALTH, HUMAN RESOURCES, SUSTAINABLE PRACTICES AND SENIOR SERVICES COMMITTEE (Ms. McLean, Chair)
 - 1. IN THE ABSENCE OF MS. MCLEAN, MS. SPECIAL STATED THERE WAS NOTHING TO REPORT

VII. STAFF REPORTS AND COMMENTS; DISCUSSION ON AGENDA ITEMS

- 1. Dave Talbott spoke about street repairs and looking into improvements at the Mannheim Metra station
- 2. John Schneider spoke about agenda item #3 regarding a resolution authorizing the initiation of an application for a zoning text amendment; agenda item #4 regarding an ordinance amending the zoning map to create the downtown zoning districts; and agenda item #11 regarding an ordinance approving an agreement by and between Kane, McKenna and Associates, Incorporated
- 3. Chief Iovinelli thanked the volunteers who helped during the Fire Department's open house. Chief Iovinelli announced health-related information is being distributed and stated he would keep everyone updated as new information comes in
- 4. Chief Witz reported a narcotics search warrant was executed on October 10 in River Grove with one person arrested. Chief Witz spoke about a prostitution sting that was executed on October 16 on Mannheim Road. There were five arrests and four vehicles impounded. Chief Witz reported the Obenauf Auction brought in approximately \$42,000 from the sale of old equipment. Chief Witz requested to go into executive session for matters of employment, compensation, discipline, performance or dismissal of certain employees
- 5. Joe Lauro reported both Village sweepers are down and that rental sweepers are being used. Mr. Lauro is looking into a sweeping contract for next year for normal street sweeping, not for leaf pickup. The department is four routes shy of the area that needs to be covered for snow plowing, due to being down a few employees. Mr. Lauro spoke about Cindy Sliwinski receiving many calls about water bills. Ms. Sliwinski is able to pull up a resident's address and check water usage immediately on the computer. Mr. Lauro reported the road salt is beginning to be delivered and that he would like the salt dome to be filled before the first snow. Mr. Lauro spoke about the Vac-con truck not being in service and he is looking into purchasing another truck
