# VII. STAFF REPORTS AND COMMENTS; DISCUSSION ON AGENDA ITEMS

- 1. Ron Heller reported he is working on the village's tax levy ordinance and it will not exceed the 5% tax cap nor the CPI, which is expected to be approximately 1.7%; therefore, it is expected that the Village's tax levy ordinance will not exceed a 1.7% increase of the amount actually extended by the county based on the tax levy ordinance of the preceding year
- 2. Carmen Cupello thanked Village Clerk Tommy Thomson for finding the company Municode. Mr. Cupello spoke about the pre-bid meeting for the Village Hall roof. The bid opening will be this Wednesday, November 5. Mr. Cupello reported there have been 1,250 permits issued this year
- 3. Chief Iovinelli spoke about last Friday's wind storm causing a pole to snap and power lines to come down. Chief Iovinelli reported the Police Department and Utilities Department vehicles now have isolation kits
- 4. Joe Lauro thanked Chief Iovinelli for the isolation kits. Mr. Lauro spoke about agenda item #7 regarding approving the proposal from T-Cat Enterprises, Incorporated (Trumbull Excavating and Trucking) to excavate, slope, grade and repair the shoulders and draining ditch along Franklin Avenue, west of the Tri-State toll way. Mr. Lauro spoke about the Scott Street Basin project being behind schedule due to the utility companies. Mr. Lauro spoke about the contractors needing to pour all concrete driveways, curbs, streets and sidewalks starting this Wednesday, and letters will be distributed to the residents to notify them. The water mains will be worked on throughout the winter. Mr. Lauro spoke about the roof at the clearing pump station being blown off during the wind storm
- 5. Eric Richard spoke about agenda item #3 regarding a resolution supporting a class 6b real estate tax assessment application by Realty Associates Fund VIII for an industrial facility located at 3501 Mount Prospect Road
- 6. Dave Talbott spoke about Nicor Gas putting in new gas lines and this being the reason for delays to the Scott Street Basins project. Mr. Talbott spoke about Nicor Gas and all the construction work they will be performing throughout the northern part of the Village. Mr. Talbott offered to do his presentation on quiet zones at the next board meeting
