I am pleased to announce that the Village of Franklin Park has been named a 2020 Tree City USA by the Arbor Day Foundation. We received this honor as recognition of our efforts in urban forest management.

The Foundation acclaimed Franklin Park because we have met or exceeded their four requirements: establishment of a tree department, passing a tree care ordinance, budgeting at least \$2 per capita for community forestry and observing Arbor Day.

Planting and maintaining healthy trees, improves our air quality, provides protection from extreme heat, and helps to conserve energy resources. Trees also help to mitigate flooding. Equally, trees impact our personal health and well-being. Planting and caring for trees ensure that generations to come will enjoy a better quality of life.

Let's all Work to Keep Our Community Clean

We can all help to keep our community clean and looking great by maintaining our property. Spring is a good time to get out and clean-up your backyard. Remove debris and clutter that can provide unwanted animals with shelter including firewood, brush, and dense shrubbery. Firewood stacks should be elevated off the ground. Garbage bins should be closed and securely fastened to stop unwanted critters from using them as a hunting ground for food. It is also important to keep the area around your trash cans free of trash, food scraps and spills. Make sure to pick ripe fruits and vegetables in your garden right away to eliminate a food source for pests and insects.

Mow your lawn regularly and eliminate weeds in alleys and areas behind homes. Grass and weeds should not exceed six inches in height to prevent mosquitoes and rodents from hiding and breeding there.

Also, please remember to clean-up after your pet while on walks and in your own backyard. Dog waste is full of disease-causing bacteria and parasites that can be harmful to humans and is a food supply for rodents. Also, do not leave pet food or water bowls outside which can attract unwanted wildlife.

Doing Spring Cleaning on Your Property?

If you are cleaning out bulk items in your basement, garage or shed, remodeling or getting a roof repaired, you may want to consider renting a roll-out dumpster for your waste needs. The Village's waste hauler Republic Services rents roll-out dumpsters and is offering a 10% discount on the standard price to Franklin Park residents (all other standard fees apply). pedestrian safety improvements will allow the two Villages to qualify for the Quiet Zone. Since last fall METRA has been working to construct the required safety improvements which include upgrading crossing equipment technology at Scott Street, a new pedestrian crossing at the Rose Street grade crossing, installing new gates at the Calwagner pedestrian grade crossing and shifting the pedestrian grade crossing at the Metra depot.

Unfortunately, METRA has informed the Village that due to COVID-related setbacks, they will not be able to complete their work this summer as expected and have extended their estimated completion date to late October. The Village is proceeding with making street improvements including installing plastic delineators down the centerline of the roads at 25th and Ruby. Please watch our Village newsletter for updates on this important project.


Memorial Day Observance – May 31

Pay Citations Online

Beginning May 1 Franklin Park Police officers will begin issuing citations using the Quicket Solutions software. This software offers a convenient online payment system that allows you to pay citations via our website. The online payment portal is safe and easy to use for ticket payments, to obtain permits and download traffic reports. You can access the payment portal through the Village website at voftp.com or at payquicket.com. Simply click onto the state and then the police department using the drop-down menu to proceed.

2021 Vehicle Stickers Announced

Renewal applications for the Village's 2021 vehicle sticker will be mailed in late May. Residents are encouraged to renew their stickers via mail, online at voftp.com or by using the Village Hall parking lot drop box. You can also renew at Village Hall on Monday through Friday from 8 AM to 4:30 PM. If possible, please do not wait until the last minute to renew because this could cause a processing back-up and a long wait to receive your sticker.

Every vehicle registered to a Franklin Park resident needs a vehicle sticker including cars, trucks, motorcycles, etc. Passenger car stickers cost \$30. Seniors receive one free vehicle sticker per household. Owners of electric vehicles receive a free vehicle sticker and hybrid vehicles pay a reduced rate of \$15.

If you purchased a new vehicle or just moved to Franklin Park, we will need a copy of the plate registration showing your Franklin Park address and payment for the type of vehicle. If you have questions, please call (847) 671-4800.

FEMA is Accepting Applications for Covid-related Funeral Assistance

FEMA will reimburse families up to \$9,000 to help with COVID-19 funeral costs. The funds are being provided through the Coronavirus Response and Relief Supplemental Appropriations Act and American Rescue Plan Act of 2021. To be eligible, families seeking assistance must meet the following:

- The death must have occurred in the United States, including the U.S. territories, and the District of Columbia.
- The death certificate must indicate the death was attributed to COVID-19.
- The applicant must be a U.S. citizen, non-citizen national, or qualified alien who incurred funeral expenses after January 20, 2020.
- There is no requirement for the deceased person to have been a U.S. citizen, non-citizen national, or qualified alien.

The COVID-19 Funeral Assistance call center will operate from 8 AM to 8 PM CT, Monday through Friday. To apply, call (844) 684-6333 or TTY: 800-462-7585.

Beware of scams. FEMA will not contact you prior to you registering for assistance. Some funeral homes can guide you through the application process. Eligible families will receive a check by mail, or direct deposit, depending on which option you choose.

Chamber Scholarship Winners Announced


