Our Sustainability Efforts Acknowledged

There is still great weather to enjoy. Inside our newsletter, you will find details on fun, family-friendly fall festivities. The Park District's Annual Fall Parade is coming up and we all love a parade!! The Pumpkin Fest will be held following the parade on October 2. Triton College will hold their annual Fall Family Fun Fest on October 1. Our Cook County Forest Preserves are a beautiful place to enjoy the beautiful fall colors. We are fortunate to have access to many acres of Forest Preserve land near Franklin Park. Plan a hike, a leisurely stroll, or the last family picnic of the season while the weather is still warm.

I want to thank the Morton Arboretum for selecting the Village of Franklin Park as the recipient of a grant to plant 50 new trees. The trees will be planted this October along 25th Avenue from Armitage Avenue to Grand Avenue. The no match grant is funded through the Chicagoland Tree Initiative, a regional effort to increase the tree canopy.

The Metropolitan Mayors Caucus, through the Powering Safe Communities Program Grant in partnership with ComEd, has awarded the Village a \$10,000 grant for EV (electric vehicle) charging projects. Recognizing that EVs can reduce carbon emissions, and improve public health outcomes, there is a special focus on electrification projects this year. EV projects that improve public health outcomes, provide for cleaner transportation options, and conserve the usage of energy are eligible. Our grant will be used to fund a portion of the purchase and installation of new electric vehicle charging stations. The stations will be designated to serve municipal owned electric vehicles at the Public Works facility. The charging stations may also be used by the public when not in use by Village personnel.

Triton Host's Fall Family Fun Fest - October 1

Triton College will host its annual Fall Family Fun Fest on Saturday, October 1 from 10 AM until 2 PM. The event is free and open to the public.
