#### Train Horns Will Be Fewer and Further Between The Village is pleased to report that the

Quiet Zone designation will continue to go into effect over the next several The second installment of Cook weeks. This designation will spare residents from train horn blasts required ahead of each pedestrian crossing. With this Quiet Zone designation,

train engineers will no longer be legally required to sound their horns. However, if the train engineer perceives a threat on or near the tracks, such as seeing a car, pedestrian, or an animal on the tracks, they can still blow the horn. Also, an engineer can sound their horn when passing another train, if a train is stopped on the tracks, or if a passenger train is picking up passengers. In addition, an engineer may sound their horn in the railyard located west of Mannheim Road.

When our Quiet Zone designation was granted, the railroads were notified to remove the automatic triggering of the computerized mandatory sounding of the horn. Please note that this may take several months to have this system reprogrammed.

The Quiet Zone designation is the result of years of hard work and determination by the Village Board and staff. Our regional, state, and federal partners collaborated with us to obtain this benefit for our community. This effort demonstrates the achievements that result from working together for the common good.

I would like to offer special thanks to Mayor David Guerin of River Grove for being a steadfast partner and gracious neighbor throughout this process.

Property Tax Update

County's Property Tax bills reflects the recent reassessment of home values performed by the Assessor's Office in our area and is resulting in dramatic increases in residential tax bills. The reassessment raised property values considerably, and the property tax bills are higher accordingly. This is impacting homeowners in River Grove, Schiller Park, Northlake, Franklin Park, and other communities throughout Leyden Township and other parts of Cook County.

As Mayor, I am sensitive to and concerned about the increased burden being placed on our homeowners, many of whom are families who are already experiencing an over-stretched budget or are seniors dependent on a fixed income. The Village of Franklin Park has been holding the line on property taxes for more than a decade. The increase in taxes results from the Assessor increasing the official value of your home. If you believe that your home's official value is too high, you may appeal the assessed value of your home with the Assessor.

I contacted the Assessor's Office for a reasonable and thorough explanation of these significant increases, some of which are 30% or even higher than previous bills I have also requested that Assessor Fritz Kaegi attend a Village Board meeting to discuss this matter.

Please check your property tax bill carefully to make sure you are receiving all the exemptions for which you qualify

#### Important Notice Regarding Garbage Collection Rates

The monthly garbage collection fee will increase for owners of a single-family or two-family residence effective October 1, 2023. Homeowners currently pay a monthly garbage collection fee of \$25.45, and the new monthly rate will be \$26.60, an increase of \$1.15 per month. The collection service days will remain unchanged and will continue to include removing unlimited garbage and recycling on Mondays and yard waste removal on Tuesdays.

The Village will continue to subsidize the garbage collection rate for qualified senior citizens, age 65 and older to allow them to receive FREE monthly garbage collection services. Qualified disabled and low-income residents will continue to be eligible to receive a reduced garbage collection fee of 50 percent. Seniors and disabled residents must demonstrate their eligibility every year by January by 15. Eligibility information is available at vofp.com.

In addition, the Village will continue to pay the cost to provide FREE unlimited, year- round access to the electronic recycling bin located at 9364 Franklin Avenue (north of Franklin & Martens intersection) which is open Monday through Friday from 7:30 AM to 3 PM. Residents also receive free seasonal branch pick up in Franklin Park.

The new garbage collection fee is included in your November billing statement for water and sewer service.
