The Village has adopted the Grand Avenue Corridor Plan which will serve as a framework to make decisions regarding land use, transportation, economic development, and other infrastructure improvements along Grand Avenue.

Input from the community was a critical part of the planning process. Thank you to the residents, senior citizens, transit riders, property owners, and members of the business community who took the time to attend planning meetings and make their voices heard about what is important to them as we move forward.

The plan will focus on:

Mayor's Desk

- Making improvements to Grand Avenue will provide a safer and more accessible street for pedestrians, bicyclists, and vehicles. It will also create a more walkable and enjoyable experience for all.
- Promoting access to public transit along the Grand Avenue corridor by making it more convenient and easier to reach bus stops.
- Identifying economic development opportunities to support small businesses and to utilize vacant properties for outdoor dining, art installations, community events, and temporary uses, such as pop-up stores, and pop-up parks, and more.
- Including landscaping that expands the tree canopy and adds greenery to prevent flooding. This will make Grand Avenue more inviting.

Program Provides Coverage for Outside Water Lines




A letter was recently mailed to residents from Service Line Warranties of America (SLWA) that details an affordable program to protect homeowners from emergency repairs to exterior water service lines and exterior sewer lines. Often, homeowners are unaware of their responsibility to cover costs for repairs to these systems in and around their home.

The program includes coverage for repairs to the clogged, broken, or leaking line serving the residential home when the flow of the line is interrupted due to normal wear and tear.

Vehicle Sticker Renewals

Renewal applications for the Village's 2025-26 vehicle stickers were mailed at the end of May. Every vehicle registered to a Franklin Park resident needs a vehicle sticker. Passenger car stickers cost \$30. Seniors and active-duty military receive one free vehicle sticker per household. Veterans pay a reduced rate of \$15 for one vehicle sticker per household.





A valid vehicle sticker allows you to park on most Village streets, but you still must obey parking restrictions posted on signs. For example, having a Village vehicle sticker does not mean you can park on streets that indicate "Resident Parking Only" because that means only residents who live on that street can park there. Meals on Wheels Hosted a "Day of Advocacy" to Champion Senior Services

In celebration of Older Americans Month, Meals on Wheels for Northern Illinois invited the community to participate in a Day of Advocacy in Franklin Park on May 28.
