Be Prepared, Extreme Weather Is Now The New Normal

As global temperatures continue to rise due to climate disruption, we are again seeing an increase in the frequency of weather extremes, including heatwaves and severe storms with heavy rainfall. So far this summer, Franklin Park has been lucky and has not experienced the flooding that many nearby towns have.

But it could be just a matter of time before a massive storm causes flooding in our Village. Our best defense is to be prepared. Now is the time to clean up our basements by picking up items from the floor including rugs and boxes and store them up higher. Also, remember to clean up backyards and other areas around our homes that could be damaged by heavy rainfall.

We can expect volatile weather to continue as human caused climate disruption warms the oceans, adding more strength to hurricanes and impacting weather across the country. Franklin Park has improved stormwater capacity and reduced floodplains, but heavy rainfall in a brief time could still overwhelm the system. Take this time to do what you can to be prepared.

Cook County Assessor's Office Accepting Appeals Now

The Cook County Assessor's Office recently sent a letter to Franklin Park homeowners explaining that they have reassessed residential properties in our area this year. That assessment indicated a rise in property values in Franklin Park. The impact of the higher assessed value will be reflected on your July 2026 property tax bill.

Homeowners can file an appeal for their new assessed valuation. By appealing you can help ensure the accuracy of the assessment.

Attend the "Understanding Reassessment Notices Workshop" - August 20 at 6 PM at the Police Station. Join representatives from the Cook County Assessor's Office to learn about the recent reassessments in Leyden Township. They will explain the assessment process, help you determine if an appeal should be filed, and help you learn how to file for an appeal. You will be able to participate in a Question-and-Answer session too.

File an appeal yourself online as soon as possible at www.cookcountyassessor.com/online-appeals. The deadline for filing an appeal is September 2. You can obtain a list of comparable properties from the Leyden Township's Assessor's Office BUT they are only able to accept requests until August 22.
