Mayor's Desk

As Mayor, the safety and health of our community is my primary concern. What happened in Franklin Park recently, during an attempted ICE apprehension, shook our community to the core.

As of this writing, we are still awaiting the results of a thorough investigation into the incident and a complete accounting of the events. This was a tragedy, and to avoid future devastating incidents we ask for transparency and accountability. ICE agents, and all local, state, and federal officers must act responsibly and be fully aware of possible collateral damage that could occur.

I pledge to work with all elected officials and community leaders to find ways to increase safety and end reckless apprehensions.

I am asking everyone to remain calm in light of this tragedy. I urge all to act peacefully, lawfully, respectfully and with the concern we have always shown to our neighbors and neighborhoods.

On behalf of the Village, we offer our condolences to the family of the deceased and wish a speedy and full recovery for the injured officer.

For those of you who have asked, Illinois law strictly prohibits local law enforcement from cooperating or interfering with U.S. Immigration and Customs Enforcement (ICE) on immigration enforcement matters and acting on federal immigration detainers. Our Franklin Park officers cannot assist or interfere in these situations.

Our Police and Fire Departments will continue to safeguard our community, residents, and our businesses.

The Franklin Park Fire Department recently installed Safety Cloud® by HAAS Alert on three of their frontline units – Battalion 2, Truck 2, and Ambulance 1. This system digitally alerts nearby drivers when Fire Department vehicles are responding or working on an incident, helping to reduce collision risks by up to 90%! While Illinois' Move Over law already requires motorists to slow down and change lanes, lights and sirens alone are not enough. Safety Cloud bridges that gap by delivering alerts directly to:

- Navigation apps like Waze and Apple Maps
- In-dash systems of 2018+ Chrysler, Dodge, Jeep, RAM, and 2024+ Volkswagen vehicles

This means drivers get a critical heads-up before they even see or hear Fire Department units, making the roads safer for our firefighters, paramedics, and the public.

### **Leaf Pickup and Yard Waste Removal Information**

Leaf and yard waste removal service will continue through the first week of December. Leaves must be placed in brown biodegradable bags or in the Yard Waste container from Republic Services. Put your container or biodegradable bags out for pickup on Tuesdays. Leaves will not be removed if they are in plastic bags or placed in the street. Bags can be purchased at local stores.

Do not blow leaves into the street because it damages street sweeper equipment and can clog sewers causing street flooding. Burning leaves is not permitted.

The Department of Public Works will sweep curbs through late November. Check signs on your block for parking restrictions. For more information, call (847) 671-8252.

Please plan to join the Village of Franklin Park and the American Legion Post 974 as we honor all veterans who have served our country in times of war and peace. The annual Veterans Day observance will be held on Tuesday, November 11 at 11 AM at the Village's Veterans Memorial, located west of Village Hall. At the event, new names of Franklin Park residents who served in the military will be added to the Village's Veterans Monument.

The Clerk's Office is seeking new names for this year's event. To qualify, the veteran must have lived in Franklin Park, and you will need to provide a copy of their DD-214 form (Honorable Discharge Papers). Please contact the Clerk's Office by October 15 to ensure the name will be engraved (pending weather constraints) on the Village's Veterans Monument in time for this year's event.
