

Construction Update

Major infrastructure improvements have been completed for the Robinson Road subdivision, including installation of new water mains. Lead service line replacements are also complete but required longer than expected coordination with residents causing project delays. Therefore, the pavement on Robinson Road will be completed in the spring. In the meantime, residents will continue to have full access, and garbage services will resume their normal trash schedule throughout the winter. A new green space was added at the corner of the subdivision at River Road and Robinson

Road. We appreciate everyone's patience throughout the construction process.

Progress was made on the work on Washington Street between King Avenue and Belmont Avenue. New water and sewer mains have been installed, and new rain gardens and trees will be planted on the east side of the street to improve stormwater management. Roadway resurfacing and plantings will be completed in spring 2026.

Check that your sump pump and emergency power flood control system are in good working condition and determine if they should be replaced.

Also, clean your gutters and downspouts of any remaining leaves or debris. Please do not sweep the leaves into the street because they will clog the sewers causing street flooding.

You have heard me say this before, but it is worth saying it again: we cannot control the weather, but we can control how to prepare for a super storm. It is not a matter of "if" but a matter of "when." Please act now.

Seniors - Reapply NOW for Free Garbage Removal Services

Qualified senior citizens and disabled low-income homeowners are required to reapply each year to avoid receiving a bill for garbage removal service. Senior citizens aged 65 years or older who own a single residence must provide a copy of their most recent Cook County Property Tax Bill which indicates they are receiving the Senior Citizen Property Tax Exemption to receive free garbage removal services. A copy of the tax bill can be mailed, emailed, or brought to Village Hall by Tuesday, December 30 to guarantee you will receive free garbage removal for 2026.

Disabled and low-income property owners must provide proof of qualifications for the Low-Income Home Energy Assistance Program (LIHEAP) to be eligible to receive the reduced garbage collection fee of 50 percent. Please email, mail, or bring your LIHEAP award letter to Village Hall to qualify for the reduced fee by December 30.
