**WHEREAS**, the Village of Franklin Park, Cook County, Illinois (the “*Village*”) is a duly organized and existing municipal corporation created under the provisions of the laws of the State of Illinois and under the provisions of the Illinois Municipal Code, as from time to time supplemented and amended; and

**WHEREAS**, the President and Board of Trustees of the Village of Franklin Park (the “*Corporate Authorities*”) are charged with the responsibility of protecting the health, safety, and welfare of the residents of the Village; and

**WHEREAS**, the Metropolitan Water Reclamation District of Greater Chicagoland (“MWRD”) has passed a Watershed Management Ordinance (the “WMO”) which in part regulates floodplain and watershed management throughout Cook County; and

**WHEREAS**, the WMO was amended for a pilot program to allow volume control and detention trading between sites which do not meet current volume control standards and those that have excess volume control and detention capabilities within a given Watershed Planning Area (the “WPA”); and

**WHEREAS**, the Village lies within the Lower Des Plaines WPA; and

**WHEREAS**, the goal of the volume control and detention program is to provide developers and communities with an environmentally sound and cost-effective way to spur development and comply with the WMO; and

**WHEREAS**, the Corporate Authorities of the Village are committed to attracting

development that will comply with the WMO and continuously improving the Village's green infrastructure to reduce flooding events for residents; and

**WHEREAS**, the Corporate Authorities find that it is in the best interests of the residents of the Village to provide for the regulations herein specified to promote the health, safety, and welfare of the residents of the Village and the general public.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED** by the President and Board of Trustees of the Village of Franklin Park, Cook County, Illinois, as follows:

**Section 1.** That the above recitals and legislative findings are found to be true and correct and are hereby incorporated herein and made a part hereof, as if fully set forth in their entirety.

**Section 2.** The Corporate Authorities find and determine that it is necessary and desirable to amend the Village Code of Franklin Park for the purpose set forth herein and that the adoption of this Ordinance is in the best interest of the health, safety, and welfare of the residents of the Village.

**Section 3.** Section 7-9A-7 ("*Stormwater Detention*") of Article A ("*Design and Construction of Sanitary and Storm Sewers*") of Chapter 9 ("*Sewer Systems*") of Title 7 ("*Public Works and Properties*") of the Village Code of Franklin Park is hereby amended by adding the following underlined language to read, as follows:

...

(b) Detention requirements.

(1) General. Detention storage, as required in subsection A of this section 7-9A-7, may be provided in detention ponds, retention ponds, ponding on parking lots, and in underground pipes and storage chambers. Detention shall be designed to use NPDES best management practices (BMPs).

- (2) Required storage volume. All detention basins shall be designed in accordance with the requirements of the Metropolitan Water Reclamation District of Greater Chicago (MWRD) and the Village Code of Franklin Park.
- a. The detention volume required will be that necessary to store the runoff of a one hundred (100) year rainfall event for any and all durations, from the fully developed drainage tributary to the reservoir, less that volume discharged during the same duration at the approved release rate.
  - b. The approved release rate of stormwater from all developments requiring detention shall not exceed the watershed specific release rate as required by the Metropolitan Water Reclamation District of Greater Chicago (MWRD) Watershed Management Ordinance (WMO), current edition.
  - c. All calculations shall utilize the methods allowed and described under the Metropolitan Water Reclamation District of Greater Chicago's (MWRD's) Watershed Management Ordinance (WMO) and Technical Guidance Manual TGM), current edition.
  - d. Fee in-lieu-of detention: When a site is more than one (1) acre but less than three (3) acres and does not meet the requirement for detention per the Metropolitan Water Reclamation District of Greater Chicago (MWRD) Watershed Management Ordinance (WMO), a fee in -lieu of detention may be requested by the developer and reviewed by the Village Engineer under the following circumstances:
    1. The site is a redevelopment where the new impervious area does not exceed the impervious area that was present before 1972.
    2. The outfall for the site has adequate capacity to accommodate the runoff from the newly developed site.
    3. There is no localized flooding in the area to date, with such determination being verified by the village engineer.
    4. If approved by the village engineer, the fee in-lieu of detention shall be \$12.00/cf of detention volume required to the nearest hundredth of an acre-foot.
  - e. Offsite Retention. Any site that is at least three (3) acres or more and cannot meet the onsite Volume Control Practices as required by Section 503 of the WMO for a property of that size, may request to utilize "Offsite Detention Practices" as such term is defined in the WMO. The proposed Offsite Detention Practices must minimally meet the following:
    1. The requirements of Section 503(2) and (3) of the MWRD WMO, current edition, are hereby adopted and incorporated herein, as if fully set forth.



2. The proposed Offsite Detention Practice must also be located in the Village of Franklin Park. If the proposed Offsite Detention Practice is outside of the Village but within the Des Plaines Watershed, the developer must provide the village engineer with sufficient evidence that no such Offsite Detention Practices were available within the Village.
3. The Village Engineer shall review the proposed Offsite Detention Practice for compliance with relevant provisions of the WMO and all applicable sections of the Village Code of Franklin Park.
- f. Village owned property Offsite Detention Practices. Any Village owned property which meets the criteria set forth in the WMO may be utilized as an Offsite Detention Practice. The Corporate Authorities shall approve any agreement in which Village property is to be used as an Offsite Detention Practice. The proceeds set forth in such agreement shall be used for green improvement projects in the Village unless the Corporate Authorities otherwise Direct.

**Section 4.** That nothing in this Ordinance at the time of its adoption shall be construed to affect any suit or proceeding impending in any court, or any rights acquired, or liability incurred, or any cause or causes of action acquired or existing, nor shall any legal right or remedy be lost, impaired, or affected.

**Section 5.** This Ordinance, and its parts, are declared to be severable and any section, subsection, sentence, paragraph, clause, provision, or portion of this Ordinance that is declared invalid shall not affect the validity of any other portion of this Ordinance, which shall remain in full force and effect. The Corporate Authorities hereby declare that the passage of this Ordinance would have occurred, irrespective of the fact that any section, subsection, sentence, paragraph, clause, provision, or portions thereof, was at the time of passage invalid or unconstitutional.

**Section 6.** If any part of this Ordinance is found to be in conflict with any other ordinance, resolution, motion, order, or parts thereof, the most restrictive or highest standard shall prevail.

**Section 7.** This Ordinance and the rules, regulations, provisions, requirements, orders, and matters established and adopted herein shall take full force and effect after its passage and publication as required by law.

**Section 1.** That the above recital is found to be true and correct and is hereby incorporated herein and made a part hereof, as if fully set forth in its entirety.

**Section 2.** That the employees, officers, and officials of the Village, as herein provided, shall be paid in accordance with the following schedule for the period of May 1, 2022 to April 30, 2023, and as subsequently calculated as herein provided, or until such further action by the Board of Trustees. Except where indicated otherwise, the amounts set forth opposite the position are stated in terms on an annual basis. For exempt employees, the amount indicated as an annual amount is the upper limit of compensation to be paid. For payroll adjustment purposes, the computation of payment based on hourly amounts for non-salaried employees where an annual amount of compensation has been provided appears after the annual statement in parentheses. The stated amount is used for computation for a given pay period. The salary schedule for Village employees, officers, and officials is as follows:

**Section 3(A).** All non-union employees, officers and officials are eligible to participate in the Village employees’ hospitalization, dental, short-term disability, and long-term disability insurance programs. Non-union employees shall be eligible for single and/or dependent coverage at their option. Elected officials shall only be eligible for single coverage, but the Village President shall be eligible for dependant coverage, commencing with the new term of office following the election in April 2009, provided the Village President performs as a full-time Village President. With respect to non-union employees, the Village Comptroller is hereby directed to retain from payment of wages an amount equal to twenty percent (20%) of the health and dental insurance premiums assessable to the employee under the health and dental insurance program as elected by the employee. Such retained amounts shall be co-payments by the employee for participation in the Village’s health insurance plan and program. The compensation of all elected officials elected on or after April 1, 2003 shall include 100% of the premium for single coverage under the Village’s group health insurance plan to be paid by the Village, for those elected officials who elect coverage; and after the election in April 2009, 80% of the premium for dependent coverage for the Village President, to be paid by the Village, if the Village President so elects said coverage.

**Section 3(B).** Non-union employees are hereby authorized to accumulate sick days. Upon retirement, these sick days, if sufficient, can be used to purchase up to one additional year of service under the Village’s retirement plan (Illinois Municipal Retirement Fund – IMRF).

**Section 3(C).** That for purposes of determining the time of service to be eligible for progressing in steps where steps are provided for determining the salaries and other compensation involved in a position, the time of service is based solely upon active-duty service, the progression from steps being determined as a function of experience on the job, and absence from active duty shall not be included in calculation of service salary purposes.

**Section 3(D).** A non-union exempt employee with over thirty-five (35) years of active-duty service with the Village who dies while employed on a full-time basis shall receive one (1) year of annual salary. In addition, if a non-union exempt employee with over thirty-five (35) years of active-duty service with the Village participated in the Village's health and dental dependent coverage insurance program at the time of death, said employee's spouse and/or dependents shall be eligible to continue participation until such time as the spouse reaches the age of sixty-five and/or dependents the age of twenty-six, or for such time as deemed eligible under the Village's health and dental insurance plan. To maintain eligibility an amount equal to twenty percent (20%) of the health and dental insurance premiums or such applicable amount as assessed to all employees for similar insurance coverage must be paid monthly to the Village. Section 3(D) shall not apply to any elected official.

**Section 4.** Salary Schedule Relationship to New Employee; Employees at New Position, and Periodic Review/ Evaluation of Employees.

The scheduled amount of compensation set forth in this Ordinance to the extent applied to positions other than those of officers and department heads or positions for which compensation is provided by other current ordinance of the Village other than the Appropriation Ordinance and the Tax Levy Ordinance or by contract, may be reduced or increased as to a particular position under the circumstance and in the manner as provided in this Section.

- 1) In the event that a new employee is being hired to fill a vacant or new position, the employee shall be hired in an amount not to exceed the then current amount as provided for the position in this Ordinance. The amount of entry level compensation shall be recommended by the appropriate department head or supervisor and the Village Comptroller shall report the recommendation to the Board of Trustees for approval. All such recommendations shall be confidential and shall be based on the person's experience, skills, this Ordinance, the available funds remaining in the appropriations for the department or program involved, and such other matters deemed relevant by the person submitting the recommendation. Every new employee affected by the provision of this paragraph may be hired through a probationary status pending approval of salary amount as may be necessary by the Board of Trustees. Failure by the Board of Trustees to act on the recommendation within ninety (90) days of its submittal will constitute approval of the recommendation as submitted by the Village Comptroller.
- 2) In the event that a current employee is being transferred to fill a vacant or new position, that employee shall be paid no more than the amount set opposite the

position that is being filled as provided in this Ordinance. In the event that an adjustment to the amount of compensation is deemed appropriate by the department head or immediate supervisor and the Village Comptroller, then the procedures as set forth in Paragraph (1) of this section shall be followed.

- 3) In the event that department head or supervisor of employees determines that the amount of compensation, after review and evaluation of the performance of an employee, is inappropriate and should be adjusted either upward or downward, then such person may prepare a written recommendation stating the reasons, in support of the recommended adjustment and the specific circumstances which occasioned review and evaluation of the employee's performance and a projection of the expected results that may be reasonably associated with the adjustment as they relate to performance and morale within the department affected and as to the individual employee. The recommendation shall be filed with the Village Comptroller who shall review it to determine whether the funds available by appropriation to the department are sufficient given the recommended adjustment. After review for that purpose, the Village Comptroller shall file, or cause to be filed, the recommendation with the Board of Trustees. No adjustment in the amount shall occur absent confirmation by the Village Comptroller as to the sufficiency of funds appropriated for such purposes and approval by the Board of Trustees.

**Section 5.** All wages and salaries set forth herein shall be in full force and effective on May 1, 2022 and shall be paid when funds become available for such purpose. On May 1, 2023, for the period May 1, 2023 through and including April 30, 2024, the wages and salaries as of May 1, 2022, shall be automatically increased by 2.25%, as calculated by the Director of Human Resources and Operations and Village Comptroller, and shall be paid when funds become available for such purpose. On May 1, 2024, for the period May 1, 2024 through and including April 30, 2025, the wages and salaries as of May 1, 2023, shall be automatically increased by 2.50%, as calculated by the Director of Human Resources and Operations and Village Comptroller, and shall be paid when funds become available for such purpose. All wages and salaries herein provided, or as subsequently amended as herein required, shall apply and be paid only to those employees and officers duly appointed and qualified to hold such position or presently employed and whose position or employment is in good standing as of the date of this Ordinance, or the date of any salary increase as herein required. Elected Officials, the Liquor Commissioner and the Village Treasurer shall not receive any increase in wages or salary.

**Section 6.** Any existing positions for which salaries are not stated or provided in this Ordinance shall continue to be compensated at the level of salary as last approved by the Board of Trustees for such positions except in the event of termination of the position or of the employee or reduction in compensation at which time this authorization shall cease.

**Section 7.** All positions listed above that have an asterisk (\*) following the position are hereby designated as exempt employees and as such shall be considered salaried employees

and not eligible for overtime compensation.

**Section 8.** The salary of the Fleet Maintenance Supervisor set forth in Section 2 of this Ordinance shall be in full force and effect retroactive to April 1, 2022.

**Section 9.** This Ordinance, and its parts, are declared to be severable and any section, clause, provision, or portion of this Ordinance that is declared invalid shall not affect the validity of any other provision of this Ordinance, which shall remain in full force and effect.

**Section 10.** All ordinances, resolutions, motions, or orders in conflict with this Ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict.

**Section 11.** This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect immediately upon its passage and approval to ensure that public services are maintained and the health, safety, and welfare of the residents of the Village is duly protected.

**AN ORDINANCE OF THE VILLAGE OF FRANKLIN PARK, COOK COUNTY, ILLINOIS APPROVING A PURCHASE AND SALE AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE VILLAGE AND JAGG PROPERTIES 2, LLC FOR THE VILLAGE OWNED PARCEL OF REAL PROPERTY AT 9800 FRANKLIN AVENUE**

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**WHEREAS**, the Village of Franklin Park, Cook County, Illinois (the “*Village*”) is a duly organized and existing municipal corporation created under the provisions of the laws of the State of Illinois and under the provisions of the Illinois Municipal Code, as from time to time supplemented and amended; and

**WHEREAS**, the Village is the owner of a parcel of property commonly known as 9800 Franklin Avenue, Franklin Park, Illinois, identified by PINS 12-21-418-029-0000 and 12-21-418-047-0000, which is an 8,386 square foot corner lot (0.19 acres) that is improved with a brick one-story, single tenant light industrial building approximately 4,925 square feet in size constructed around 1970 (the “*Property*”), and legally described on Exhibit A, a copy of which is attached hereto and made a part hereof; and

**WHEREAS**, the Property is in the DT-2 Downtown Mix District, as identified and described in the Village of Franklin Park Zoning Ordinance; and

**WHEREAS**, the President and Board of Trustees of the Village of Franklin Park (the “*Corporate Authorities*”) previously found that the Property is no longer necessary, appropriate, required for the use of, profitable to or serve any viable use to the Village and that the sale of the Property will eliminate burdensome maintenance cost, provide needed funds and generate tax revenue for use in the general fund of the Village; and

**WHEREAS**, the Corporate Authorities further determined that the Property serves no public use to the residents of the Village and is in the best interest of the health, safety, and



welfare of Village residents to sell the Property; and

**WHEREAS**, 65 ILCS 5/11-76-4.1 of the Illinois Municipal Code sets forth a procedure for the sale of municipal-owned surplus real property by listing such property for sale through a local licensed real estate agency provided the agent's compensation shall be included in the resolution after ascertaining the value of the surplus real estate by written appraisal and making said appraisal available for public inspection; and

**WHEREAS**, 65 ILCS 5/11-76-4.1 of the Illinois Municipal Code authorizes the Corporate Authorities to accept any contract proposal determined by them to be in the best interest of the Village by a vote of two-thirds (2/3) of the Corporate Authorities, but in no event at a price less than eighty percent (80%) of the appraised value of the Property; and

**WHEREAS**, the Corporate Authorities have determined it is in the best interests of the Village to sell the Property pursuant to 65 ILCS 5/11-76-4.1 of the Illinois Municipal Code; and

**WHEREAS**, the Village ascertained a written appraisal report for the Property, dated July 23, 2021, which was prepared by Mary Wagner, MAI, and Elizabeth Gulis, MAI, of Praedium Valuation Group, 3847 North Lincoln Avenue, 2nd Floor, Chicago, Illinois, (the "Appraisal"); and

**WHEREAS**, the Appraisal determined the value of the Property to be \$148,000.00; and

**WHEREAS**, on September 7, 2021, the Corporate Authorities adopted Resolution Number 2122-R-10 entitled "*A Resolution of the Village of Franklin Park, Cook County, Illinois Declaring as Surplus Property the Village Owned Parcel of Real Property at 9800 Franklin Avenue and Further Authorizing an Exclusive Right to Sell Agreement with Darwin Realty and Development Corporation to Market and Sell the Property and Direct the Village Clerk to Make a Copy of the Appraisal on the Property Available to Any Party*"; and

**WHEREAS**, on September 16, 2021, the Village published a “*Public Notice of Sale of Surplus Real Property Owned by the Village of Franklin Park at 9800 Franklin Avenue*” with a copy of Resolution Number 2122-R-10 in the Franklin Park Herald-Journal, a newspaper of general circulation in the Village, to advise the public that the Village declared the Property to be surplus property and was listing the Property for sale with Darwin Realty and Development Corporation (“*Darwin*”); and

**WHEREAS**, the Public Notice, Appraisal, Resolution Number 2122-R-10 and the Exclusive Right to Sell Agreement between the Village and Darwin were also made available for inspection or copying in the office of the Village Clerk of the Village of Franklin Park and on the Village’s website to any interested party; and

**WHEREAS**, the Village received a proposal for the purchase of the Property from Jagg Properties 2, LLC in the amount of \$125,000.00, which is a price higher than eighty percent (80%) of the appraised value of the Property (the “*Proposal*”); and

**WHEREAS**, the Director of Community Development was authorized in Resolution Number 2122-R-10 to work with Darwin to review proposals for the sale of the Property and further recommend and present a final agreement to the Corporate Authorities for the sale and redevelopment of the Property in accordance with said Resolution Number 2122-R-10 and pursuant to 65 ILCS 5/11-76-4.1 of the Illinois Municipal Code; and

**WHEREAS**, the Director of Community Development, pursuant to Resolution 2122-R-10, is hereby presenting the terms of the sale of the Property for consideration by the Corporate Authorities.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED** by the President and Board of Trustees of the Village of Franklin Park, Cook County, Illinois, as follows:

**Section 1.** That the above recitals and legislative findings are found to be true and correct and are hereby incorporated herein and made a part hereof, as if fully set forth in their entirety.

**Section 2.** The Property, as herein described, is hereby determined, and declared by the Corporate Authorities to be surplus real estate of the Village.

**Section 3.** The Purchase and Sale Agreement by and between the Village of Franklin Park and Jagg Properties 2, LLC (the “*Agreement*”), a copy of which is attached hereto and made a part hereof as Exhibit B, is hereby approved in the form presented to this Village Board, with such necessary changes as may be authorized by the Village President, the execution thereof by the Village President to constitute the approval of the Corporate Authorities of any and all changes or revisions therein contained.

**Section 4.** The Village President and Village Clerk are hereby authorized and directed to execute and deliver the Agreement and all other documents necessary to implement the provisions, terms and conditions thereof, as therein described, and the Village Attorney is further authorized to prepare and execute any document and take such required action to provide for the conveyance of the Property.

**Section 5.** The officials, officers, employees, and attorneys of the Village are hereby authorized to take such further actions and incur such costs as are necessary to carry out the intent and purpose of this Ordinance and the Agreement and complete the sale of the Property, as contemplated herein.

**Section 6.** If any section, paragraph, clause, or provision of this Ordinance shall be held invalid, the invalidity thereof shall not affect any other provision of this Ordinance.

**Section 7.** All ordinances, resolutions, motions, or orders in conflict with this

Ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict.

**Section 8.** This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect immediately after its passage and publication as required by law.

**AN ORDINANCE OF THE VILLAGE OF FRANKLIN PARK, COOK COUNTY, ILLINOIS, GRANTING A CONDITIONAL USE TO ALLOW FOR A “CONCRETE MIXING PLANT” USE WITHIN THE I-2 GENERAL INDUSTRIAL DISTRICT (ZBA 22-06: 10545 WAVELAND AVENUE)**

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**WHEREAS**, the Village of Franklin Park, Cook County, Illinois (the “*Village*”) is a duly organized and existing municipal corporation created under the provisions of the laws of the State of Illinois and under the provisions of the Illinois Municipal Code, as from time to time supplemented and amended; and

**WHEREAS**, the President and Board of Trustees of the Village of Franklin Park (the “*Corporate Authorities*”) have heretofore exercised the power conferred on them pursuant to Chapter 11-13-1, *et seq.*, of the Illinois Municipal Code by adopting the Franklin Park Zoning Ordinance in 1974 (Ord. 7475 Z-10), as amended from time to time; and

**WHEREAS**, a conditional use application, ZBA 22-06, has been submitted to the Village by Ozinga Ready Mix Concrete, Inc., as tenant and Waveland Materials LLC, as owner (the “*Applicants*”), to allow within the I-2 General Industrial District a “concrete mixing plant” use (the “*Conditional Use*”) on the property commonly known as 10545 Waveland Avenue, Franklin Park, Illinois and as legally described and depicted on Exhibit A (the “*Property*”); and

**WHEREAS**, the Zoning Board of Appeals held a public hearing on April 6, 2022 on whether the Conditional Use should be approved, at which time all persons present were afforded an opportunity to be heard; and

**WHEREAS**, a public notice in the form required by law was given of said public hearing date; and

**WHEREAS**, the Zoning Board of Appeals has filed its findings of fact and recommendations that the Conditional Use be granted, and the Corporate Authorities have duly considered said findings of fact and recommendations; and

**WHEREAS**, the Corporate Authorities have determined, in the best interest of the health, safety and welfare of the residents of the Village, to grant the Conditional Use subject to the conditions identified herein.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED** by the President and Board of Trustees of the Village of Franklin Park, Cook County, Illinois, as follows:

**Section 1.** The above recitals and legislative findings are found to be true and correct and are hereby incorporated herein and made a part hereof, as if fully set forth in their entirety.

**Section 2.** The President and Board of Trustees hereby adopt by reference the findings of fact of the Zoning Board of Appeals as findings of the President and the Board of Trustees as if completely set forth herein. All documents and exhibits submitted at the aforesaid public hearings are also incorporated by reference into this Ordinance.

**Section 3.** In addition to the findings set forth in Section 2 hereof, the President and the Board of Trustees further find in relation to the Conditional Use as follows:

1. The establishment, maintenance, or operation of the Conditional Use, subject to the conditions set forth herein, will not be detrimental to, or endanger the public health, safety, morals, comfort, or general welfare;
2. The Conditional Use, subject to the conditions set forth herein, will not be injurious to the use and enjoyment of other property in the immediate vicinity for the purposes already permitted, nor substantially diminish and impair property values within the neighborhood;

3. The Conditional Use, subject to the conditions set forth herein, will not impede the normal and orderly development of the surrounding property for uses permitted in the I-2 General Industrial District;
4. The Conditional Use, subject to the conditions set forth herein, will not affect the exterior architectural appeal and functional plan of structures already constructed as to cause a substantial depreciation in property values within the neighborhood as the proposed plans will be an improvement upon the existing structure;
5. Adequate utilities, access roads, drainage and necessary facilities for the Conditional Use are already in place at the Property;
6. Ingress and egress for the Conditional Use, subject to the conditions set forth herein, shall minimally affect traffic congestion on the public streets; and
7. The Conditional Use shall, in all other respects, conform to the applicable regulations of the I-2 General Industrial District, except as such regulations may, in each instance, be modified by the Board of Trustees pursuant to the recommendations of the Zoning Board of Appeals.

**Section 4.** The Conditional Use, subject to the conditions set forth below, are hereby granted and issued for a “concrete mixing plant” use in the I-2 General Industrial District located at 10545 Waveland Avenue, Franklin Park, Illinois, and as legally described on Exhibit A.

This Conditional Use is subject to the following conditions:

1. That the Fugitive Particulate Matter Control Plan submitted by the Applicants be adhered to at all times.
2. That the Fugitive Particulate Matter Control Plan include the use of a sweeper and water truck log to account for days/times that the vehicles were in use at the facility.
3. That the Fugitive Particulate Matter Control Plan include the running of the sweeper and water truck on the roads outside of the facility 1) during facility operations and 2) an hour or so before facility operations begin and an hour or so after facility operations are complete to prevent/capture any additional fugitive dust that make it to the road.
4. At the Applicants’ expense, the applicant will periodically test for dust and odor emissions, using the services of a consultant selected by the Village. The Applicant will provide the results of these tests to the Village.

5. Should testing reveal unacceptable levels of dust, odor or any other contamination, the Applicants will resolve these issues at Applicants' expense and to the satisfaction of the Village.
6. That the Applicants will promptly address any and all concerns from other nearby properties with regards to dust and debris to the satisfaction of the Village.
7. That the queuing and parking of trucks only occur on the property and not on the Village right-of-way.
8. That the Applicants agree to comply with all Village, County, State and Federal laws, codes, and regulations that are applicable to the Applicant's property and the use thereof. These include, but are not limited to, Village Code Section 4-3A-7 regarding odors and wind born materials and Cook County Code Sections 30-7(a) and 30-21(a) regarding emissions and combustibles.
9. That the proposed use complies with all Village Code requirements at all times.

**Section 5.** The Applicant hereunder shall at all times comply with all Village regulations and the terms and conditions of the Conditional Use and in the event of non-compliance, said permit shall be subject to revocation by appropriate legal proceedings.

**Section 6.** If any section, paragraph, clause, or provision of this Ordinance shall be held invalid, the invalidity thereof shall not affect any other provision of this Ordinance.

**Section 7.** All ordinances, resolutions, motions, or orders in conflict with this Ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict.

**Section 8.** This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect following its passage, approval and publication in pamphlet form as provided by law.
