**WHEREAS**, the President and Board of Trustees of the Village of Franklin Park (the “*Corporate Authorities*”) have heretofore exercised the power conferred on them pursuant to 65 ILCS 5/11-13-1, *et seq.*, of the Illinois Municipal Code by adopting the Franklin Park Zoning Ordinance (Ord. 7475 Z10 and Ord. 2223-VC-11), as from time to time supplemented and amended (collectively the “*Zoning Code*”); and

**WHEREAS**, a text amendment application, ZBA 23-11, has been submitted by the Village requesting an amendment to Section 9-10-3(G) of the Zoning Code regarding barbed wire restrictions and public utility fence requirements (the “*Proposed Amendment*”); and

G. Fences, hedges, and walls.

1. General requirements.

h. The following materials are prohibited in the construction of fences and walls:

- i. Scrap metal.
- ii. Corrugated metal.

- iii. Sheet metal.
- iv. Electrical fences or any kind of electrically charged fences.
- v. Pallets.
- vi. Oriented strand board (OSB).
- vii. Plywood.
- viii. Chicken wire.
- ix. Plastic mesh (except if used in a manner accessory to a Village-approved temporary use, event, maintenance, or construction).
- x. Barbed wire (except as used for a Public Utility).

...

4. Fencing and barbed wire for public utilities.

- a. Barbed wire is permitted only for public utility uses. Public utility uses must be ~~fenced~~ enclosed by a solid fence.
- b. Only standard barbed wire is permitted. Razor wire, barbed selvedge, and concertina type barbed wire are prohibited.
- c. The use of barbed wire must meet the following standards:
  - i. It is located a minimum of six (6) feet above the ground level.
  - ii. It does not overhang any lot lines.
  - iii. It is not comprised of more than three (3) strains.
  - iv. It is angled inward to the property at an approximate forty-five (45) degree angle.
  - v. It must be oriented inward toward the public utility use.
  - vi. Spikes, nails, barbed selvedge, or any pointed instruments of any kind used in conjunction with barbed wire are prohibited.
- d. Fences, walls, and hedges in all public utility yards are required to be a minimum height of eight (8) feet and are limited to a maximum height of twelve (12) feet.
- e. Fences, walls, and hedges cannot be located within the minimum front setback of the applicable zoning district.

...

**Section 4.** All sections of the Franklin Park Zoning Ordinance not addressed in this Ordinance, or another amending ordinance shall remain in full force and effect.

**WHEREAS**, the President and Board of Trustees of the Village of Franklin Park (the “*Corporate Authorities*”) have heretofore exercised the power conferred on them pursuant to 65 ILCS 5/11-13-1, *et seq.*, of the Illinois Municipal Code by adopting the Franklin Park Zoning Ordinance (Ord. 7475 Z10 and Ord. 2223-VC-11), as from time to time supplemented and amended (collectively the “*Zoning Code*”); and

**WHEREAS**, a text amendment application, ZBA 23-10, has been submitted by the Village requesting an amendment to Section 9-13-2 and 9-13-7 of the Zoning Code regulating signs and awnings (the “*Proposed Amendment*”); and

**WHEREAS**, the Zoning Board of Appeals held a public hearing on December 6, 2023, as to whether the Proposed Amendment should be approved, at which time all persons present were afforded an opportunity to be heard; and

**WHEREAS**, a public notice in the form required by law was given of said public hearing date; and

**WHEREAS**, the Zoning Board of Appeals has filed its findings of fact and recommendations that the Proposed Amendment be granted, and the Corporate Authorities have duly considered said findings of fact and recommendations; and

**WHEREAS**, the Corporate Authorities have determined, in the best interest of the health, safety and welfare of the residents of the Village, to further amend the text of the Franklin Park Zoning Ordinance.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED** by the President and Board of Trustees of the Village of Franklin Park, Cook County, Illinois, as follows:

**Section 3.** Section 9-13-2 ("*General Standards*") of Chapter 13 ("*Signs*") of Title 9 ("*Zoning Ordinance*") is hereby amended by adding the underlined language, and by deleting the stricken language, to read as follows:

**9-13-2. – General Standards.**

All signs constructed, erected, modified, or altered must comply with the following standards.

...

F. *Construction standards.* In addition to all Building Code requirements, which control over any of these requirements, signs must meet the following:

1. Supports and braces must either be designed as an integral part of the overall sign or obscured from public view to the extent feasible. Awnings with pole supports are prohibited on the front façade.
2. All signs attached to a building must be installed and maintained so that wall penetrations are watertight and the structure does not exceed allowable stresses of supporting materials.
3. All signs must be designed and constructed in compliance with the building code, electrical code, and all other applicable codes and ordinances.



4. No sign may be painted on a wall or any other structure. As of the effective date of this Ordinance, existing painted on wall signs, called ghost signs, are exempt from this prohibition. Such signs may only be restored to the original graphic and no new information may be added to such ghost signs.
5. Glass comprising any part of a sign must be safety glass.
6. All letters, figures, characters, or representations in cut-out or irregular form, maintained in conjunction with, attached to, or superimposed upon any sign must be safely and securely built into or attached to the sign structure.
7. All electrical fixtures, devices, circuits, conduits, raceways, or similar features must be installed and maintained in compliance with the current electrical code.
8. Conduits, raceways, and other components of a sign illumination system must be designed as an integral part of the overall sign structure and obscured from public view to the extent technically feasible.
9. No sign, awning or canopy attached to the building structure which is visible to ground level traffic shall be constructed above any portion of the parapet wall.

...

**Section 4.** Section 9-13-7 ("*Sign Permit Required*") of Chapter 13 ("*Signs*") of Title 9 ("*Zoning Ordinance*") is hereby amended by adding the underlined language, and by deleting the stricken language, to read as follows:

**9-13-7. – Sign Permit Required.**

This section describes the types of signs allowed with a sign permit. Specific regulations on each sign type may include further restrictions on which districts and/or uses within a district may utilize these sign types.

...

**B. *Awning sign.***

1. Awning signs are permitted for multi-family dwellings and nonresidential uses in any district.
2. Awning signs must maintain a minimum vertical clearance of eight (8) feet.

3. Awning signs may encroach into the public right-of-way but must be located at least two (2) feet from the curb line.
4. Sign copy on any awning sign surface is limited to thirty (30) percent of each surface area. A valance is considered a separate surface area.
5. Solid awnings are permitted lettering attached to and located above the top of the awning to a maximum height of eighteen (18) inches.
6. Domed, barreled, convex, or quarter round awning shapes are prohibited. Traditional shed or concave are preferred.
7. Awning signs may be externally illuminated. All lighting must be focused on the printed area.
8. Back-lit awnings are prohibited.
9. Within any downtown district, all canvas awnings shall be the color of forest green (Sunbrella #4637 or Pantone #343C or approved equal) and any lettering shall be white.

...

**Section 5.** All sections of the Franklin Park Zoning Ordinance not addressed in this Ordinance, or another amending ordinance shall remain in full force and effect.

**WHEREAS**, the Village of Franklin Park, Cook County, Illinois (the "*Village*") is a duly organized and existing municipal corporation created under the provisions of the laws of the State of Illinois and under the provisions of the Illinois Municipal Code, as from time to time supplemented and amended; and

**WHEREAS**, the mission of BEE CITY USA is to galvanize communities to sustain pollinators, responsible for the reproduction of almost 90% of the world's flowering plant species, by providing them with healthy habitat, rich in a variety of native plants and free to nearly free of pesticides; and

**WHEREAS**, thanks to the more than 3,600 species of native bees in the United States, along with introduced honeybees, we have very diverse dietary choices rich in fruits, nuts, and vegetables; and

**WHEREAS**, bees and other pollinators have experienced population declines due to a combination of habitat loss, poor nutrition, pesticides (including insecticides, fungicides, and herbicides), parasites, diseases, and climate change; and

**WHEREAS**, pollinator-friendly communities can benefit local and regional economies through healthier ecosystems, increased vegetable and fruit crop yields, and increased demand for pollinator-friendly plant materials from local growers; and

**WHEREAS**, ideal pollinator-friendly habitat (A) is comprised of mostly native

wildflowers, grasses, vines, shrubs, and trees blooming in succession throughout the growing season to provide diverse and abundant nectar and pollen, since many wild pollinators prefer or depend on the native plants with which they co-adapted; (B) is free to nearly free of pesticides, as many pesticides can harm pollinators and their habitat; (C) comprises undisturbed spaces (leaf and brush piles, unmown fields or field margins, fallen trees and other dead wood) for nesting and overwintering; and (D) provides connectivity between habitat areas to support pollinator movement and resilience; and

**WHEREAS**, Integrated Pest Management (the “IPM”) is a long-term approach to maintaining healthy landscapes and facilities that minimizes risks to people and the environment by: identifying and removing the causes of pest problems rather than only attacking the symptoms (the pests); employing pests' natural enemies along with cultural, mechanical, and physical controls when prevention is not enough; and using pesticides only when no other method is feasible or effective; and

**WHEREAS**, supporting pollinators fosters broad-based community engagement in environmental awareness and sustainability; and

**WHEREAS**, the Village should be certified a BEE CITY USA community because it hosts annual events for pollinators on World Honeybee Day, collaborates with residents to recognize honeybee health and habitats, and is in the process of restoring Village parkways and properties with pollinator-friendly natural habitats.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED** by the President and Board of Trustees of the Village of Franklin Park, Cook County, Illinois, as follows:

**Section 1.** That the above recitals and legislative findings are found to be true and



correct and are hereby incorporated herein and made a part hereof, as if fully set forth in their entirety.

**Section 2.** The Department of Municipal Utilities, Streets, Forestry, Water and Sewer of the Village of Franklin Park is hereby designated as the BEE CITY USA sponsor on behalf of the Village of Franklin Park.

**Section 3.** The Utilities Commissioner, or designee, and Sustainable Practices, Forestry and Facilities Director of the Department of Municipal Utilities, Street, Forestry, Water and Sewer Department shall function as BEE CITY USA liaisons.

**Section 4.** Facilitation of the Village of Franklin Park's BEE CITY USA program is assigned to the Department of Municipal Utilities, Streets, Forestry, Water and Sewer and the Franklin Park Bee City USA Committee.

**Section 5.** The Department of Municipal Utilities, Streets, Forestry, Water and Sewer, Tree Preservation Commission and the Franklin Park Bee City USA Committee are authorized to and shall:

- a. Event(s). Host at least one educational event or pollinator habitat planting or restoration each year to showcase the Village's commitment to raising awareness of pollinator conservation and expanding pollinator health and habitat.
- b. Publicize and Inform. Install and maintain an authorized BEE CITY USA street sign in a prominent location, and create and maintain a webpage on the Village's website which includes, a copy of this Ordinance and a link to the national BEE CITY USA website; contact information for the Village's BEE CITY USA liaison and committee; report of pollinator-friendly activities the Village has accomplished; and recommended native plant species list and integrated pest management plan (IPM).
- c. Habitat. Develop and implement a program to create or expand pollinator-friendly habitat on public and private land, which includes, but is not limited to, identifying and inventorying Village property that can be enhanced with pollinator-friendly plantings; creating a recommended locally native plant list to include wildflowers, grasses, vines,

shrubs, and trees and a list of local suppliers for those species; and, tracking by square footage or acreage annual area of pollinator habitat created or enhanced.

d. Pollinator-Friendly Pest Management. Create and adopt an integrated pest management (IPM) plan designed to prevent pest problems, reduce pesticide use, and expand the use of non-chemical pest management methods.

e. Policy and Plan. Assist in establishing a policy to acknowledge and commit to the BEE CITY USA designation, review the Franklin Park Comprehensive Plan and other relevant documents to incorporate such policy and to consider improvements to pest management policies and practices as they relate to pollinator conservation, identify appropriate locations for pollinator-friendly plantings, and consider other appropriate measures.

f. Renewal. Renew BEE CITY USA affiliation by annually applying for Village's BEE CITY USA designation and prepare report of Village's previous year's BEE CITY USA activities and paying the renewal fee based on the Village's population.

**Section 6.** Section 7-13-21 ("*Tree Preservation Commission*") of Chapter 13 ("*Tree Preservation, Planting and Maintenance: Tree Preservation Commission*") of Title 7 ("*Public Works and Properties*") of the Village Code of Franklin Park is hereby amended by deleting the following stricken language and adding the following underlined language to read, as follows:

**7-13-21. Tree Preservation Commission; Bee City USA Committee.**

A. Tree Preservation Commission: There is hereby established a tree preservation commission for the village, which shall consist of corporate citizens and residents who shall aid the village's arborist with the promotion and preservation of trees in the village. The tree preservation commission shall be comprised of eight (8) members appointed by the president with the advice and consent of the board of trustees for a term of one (1) year or until their successors have been appointed and qualified. Members of the tree preservation commission shall act in an advisory role and serve without compensation. The chair of the property, planning, zoning, and building committee of the corporate authorities shall serve without compensation as a liaison between the tree preservation commission and the corporate authorities to promote and preserve trees in the village.

B. Bee City USA Committee: There is hereby established a special committee of the tree preservation commission to be known as the Franklin Park Bee City USA committee, which shall consist of members of the tree preservation commission along with

volunteers and supporters who shall aid the committee in hosting educational events, encouraging the public to plant appropriate native species, identifying public property locations suitable for pollinator-friendly habitats, establishing an integrated pest management plan and preparing a plan to maintain BEE CITY USA designation. Members of the committee shall act in an advisory role and serve without compensation. The chair of the property, planning, zoning, and building committee of the corporate authorities shall serve without compensation as a liaison between the committee and the corporate authorities.

**Section 7.** This Ordinance, and its parts, are declared to be severable and any section, paragraph, clause, provision, or portion of this Ordinance that is declared invalid shall not affect the validity of any other provision of this Ordinance, which shall remain in full force and effect.

**Section 8.** All ordinances, resolutions, motions, or orders in conflict with this Ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict.

**Section 9.** This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect upon its passage, approval and publication as provided by law.

**WHEREAS**, the Village of Franklin Park, Cook County, Illinois (the "*Village*") is a duly organized and existing municipal corporation created under the provisions of the laws of the State of Illinois and under the provisions of the Illinois Municipal Code, as from time to time supplemented and amended; and

**WHEREAS**, the President and Board of Trustees of the Village of Franklin Park (the "*Corporate Authorities*") are charged with the responsibility of protecting the health, safety, and welfare of the residents of the Village; and

**WHEREAS**, the Corporate Authorities have the authority to adopt ordinances to promulgate rules, regulations or policies pertaining to its government and affairs; and

**WHEREAS**, unscheduled intercity buses are attempting to stop unannounced at various times, on different days and at multiple locations near and around the Village to unload dozens of passengers; and

**WHEREAS**, the Corporate Authorities have determined that the importance of and need for regulations to provide for unscheduled intercity buses will ensure that people are treated fairly and free from deceptive practices, and deem the need to regulate unscheduled intercity buses as an essential element to protect and promote the public health, safety, and welfare of the residents of the Village; and

**WHEREAS**, the Corporate Authorities find that the economic stability of the Village is dependent upon regulations to ensure that unscheduled intercity buses that arrive in the Village do



not drain the limited financial resources of the Village, jeopardize the health, safety, and welfare of bus passengers or visitors to the Village or burden the ability of personnel of Village emergency service departments to adequately protect and serve the residents and visitors to the Village; and

**WHEREAS**, the Corporate Authorities find that it is in the best interests of the Village, its employees, its residents, its property owners, and visitors to establish regulations for the safe and orderly stopping, standing, and parking of unscheduled intercity buses and the discharge of passengers within the Village; and

**WHEREAS**, the Corporate Authorities determined that the unloading of passengers from an unscheduled intercity bus in inclement or severe weather conditions or at varied unscheduled hours, days, or locations in the Village without a coordinated plan poses a significant threat to the health, safety, and welfare of passengers; and

**WHEREAS**, the Corporate Authorities further find that time is of the essence due to the incoming inclement weather within the Chicagoland area and the immediate increase in demands on limited Village resources resulting from the unloading of passengers from an unscheduled intercity bus within the Village; and

**WHEREAS**, the Corporate Authorities determined that a humanitarian crisis will arise within the Village as it relates to the unloading and securing of passengers from unscheduled intercity buses; and

**WHEREAS**, the Corporate Authorities find that it is in the best interest of the health, safety, and welfare of the residents of the Village to establish the regulations herein specified to ensure necessary Village services and programs are prepared ahead of time.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED** by the President and Board of Trustees of the Village of Franklin Park, Cook County, Illinois, as follows:

**Section 1.** That the above recitals and legislative findings are found to be true and correct by the Corporate Authorities and are hereby incorporated herein and made a part hereof, as if fully set forth in their entirety in this Section 1.

**Section 2.** That the Corporate Authorities find and declare that the regulations and requirements herein established are to protect and ensure the health, safety, and welfare of the residents of the Village and are undertaken in accordance with and pursuant to the exercise of the Village's police powers and are further herein established and required to protect and ensure the health, safety and welfare of bus passengers and visitors to the Village and are found to be essential for the stability and security of the Village, its employees, its residents, and its property owners.

**Section 3.** The purpose of this Ordinance is to approve and adopt the Policy, as defined below, for the benefit of the Village, its employees, its residents, and visitors to the Village, and to authorize the Director of Police to take any and all action necessary to effectuate and carry out the Policy herein established, including the establishment of additional rules, procedures and general orders to clarify, implement and enforce the Policy.

**Section 4.** The Policy of the Village of Franklin Park, Cook County, Illinois Establishing Regulations for Unscheduled Intercity Buses and the Discharge of Passengers, a copy of which is attached hereto and made a part hereof, as Exhibit A (the "*Policy*"), is hereby authorized and approved.

**Section 5.** The officials, officers, employees, and attorneys of the Village are hereby authorized to take all actions necessary to carry out, give effect to, and consummate the Policy, and to take all action reasonably required in conformity therewith. The officials, officers, employees, and attorneys of the Village are hereby further authorized and directed to draft and

disseminate any and all necessary applications or forms to be utilized to effectuate and enforce the Policy and this Ordinance.

**Section 6.** This Ordinance, and its parts, are declared to be severable and any sentence, section, paragraph, sub-paragraph, clause, provision, or portion of this Ordinance or its Policy is declared unconstitutional, invalid or unenforceable said shall be excluded and deemed inoperative or unenforceable, as though not provided for herein, and shall not affect the validity or enforceability of any other part of this Ordinance and its Policy, which shall remain unaffected, unimpaired, valid, and in full force and effect. It is hereby declared to be the express legislative intent of the Corporate Authorities that this Ordinance and its Policy would have been authorized and adopted as if no such unconstitutional, invalid, or unenforceable part was included in this Ordinance or its Policy.

**Section 7.** All ordinances, resolutions, motions, or orders in conflict with this Ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict.

**Section 8.** This Ordinance is declared to be urgent and necessary for the immediate preservation of public peace, and the health, safety and welfare of the general public and shall, therefore, take effect and be in full force immediately upon its passage and approval by the Village President.

**AN ORDINANCE OF THE VILLAGE OF FRANKLIN PARK, COOK COUNTY,  
ILLINOIS ESTABLISHING A POLICY FOR EMPLOYEES PURSUANT TO  
THE PAID LEAVE FOR ALL WORKERS ACT**

**WHEREAS**, the Village of Franklin Park, Cook County, Illinois (the "*Village*") is a duly organized and existing municipal corporation created under the provisions of the laws of the State of Illinois and under the provisions of the Illinois Municipal Code, as from time to time supplemented and amended; and

**WHEREAS**, the President and Board of Trustees of the Village of Franklin Park (the "*Corporate Authorities*") may from time to time amend the text of the Village Code of Franklin Park when it is determined to be in the best interests of the residents of the Village; and

**WHEREAS**, Governor JB Pritzker signed into law the Paid Leave for All Workers Act, 820 ILCS 192/1 *et seq.*, (the "*PLAWA*"); and

**WHEREAS**, the State of Illinois did not make the necessary appropriations or include statutory language exempting PLAWA from the Illinois State Mandates Act (30 ILCS 805/1 *et seq.*); and

**WHEREAS**, effective January 1, 2024, PLAWA requires an employer to provide certain paid leave to its employees, unless the employer is subject to an existing municipal or county ordinance that requires the employer to provide any form of paid leave to its employees; and

**WHEREAS**, the Corporate Authorities recognizes the important of paid leave and currently provides reasonable paid leave benefits to its employees; and

**WHEREAS**, the Corporate Authorities determined that applying PLAWA to its own employees will negatively impact the Village and place an undue financial and operational burden

on the Village's ability to provide uninterrupted services to its residents; and

**WHEREAS**, the Village believes and hereby declares that it is in the best interests of the Village to clearly define the paid leave benefits that Village employees shall receive.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED** by the President and Board of Trustees of the Village of Franklin Park, Cook County, Illinois, as follows:

**Section 1.** That the above recitals and legislative findings are found to be true and correct and are hereby incorporated herein and made a part hereof, as if fully set forth in their entirety.

**Section 2.** The Village of Franklin Park Employee Handbook is hereby amended to incorporate and include a new Section 4.20.5 entitled "*Paid Time Off (PTO) for Part-Time Employees*", a copy of which is attached hereto and made a part hereof, as Exhibit A (the "*PTO Policy*") and such PTO Policy is hereby further authorized and adopted as the Village's PTO Policy applicable to all Village part-time employees.

**Section 3.** Pursuant to Section 15(p) of PLAWA, the Village hereby adopts its current paid leave policy for all Village employees as set forth herein and in the Village of Franklin Park Employee Handbook, the Village Code of Franklin Park, the Village's salary or appropriation ordinance, or any collective-bargaining agreement to which the Village is a party, and all other binding legislative actions governing paid leave adopted by the Corporate Authorities, as the same may be amended from time to time. However, in no event shall the Village, as an employer, provide less than one (1) day (8 hours) of paid leave per year to any Village employee.

**Section 4.** If any section, paragraph, clause, or provision of this Ordinance shall be held invalid, the invalidity thereof shall not affect any other provision of this Ordinance.



**Section 5.** All ordinances, resolutions, motions, or orders in conflict with this Ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict.

**Section 6.** This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect upon its passage, approval and publication as provided by law.

**WHEREAS**, the Village of Franklin Park, Cook County, Illinois (the “*Village*”) is a duly organized and existing municipal corporation created under the provisions of the laws of the State of Illinois and under the provisions of the Illinois Municipal Code, as from time to time supplemented and amended; and

**WHEREAS**, the President and Board of Commissioners of the County of Cook have enacted an ordinance known as the Cook County Real Property Assessment Classification Ordinance, as amended from time to time (the “*Classification Ordinance*”), which provides for a tax assessment incentive classification designed to encourage industrial development throughout Cook County by offering a real estate tax incentive for the development of new industrial facilities, the rehabilitation of existing industrial structures and the utilization of abandoned industrial buildings in order to create employment opportunities and expand the tax base; and

**WHEREAS**, Digital Grand Avenue 3, LLC (the “*Applicant*”) is the owner of an industrial property commonly known as 2425 – 2553 Edgington Street, Franklin Park, Illinois, and hereinafter legally described on Exhibit A, a copy of which is attached hereto and made a part hereof (the “*Property*”); and

**WHEREAS**, Applicant acquired the Property for value in order to demolish the existing building, remediate all identifiable environmental conditions and construct a 405,111 square foot two-story data center facility on the Property, the viability of such being dependent on the granting

of a Cook County Class 6B Tax Assessment Classification, as said term is defined in the Classification Ordinance (the "*Class 6B Tax Assessment Classification*"); and

**WHEREAS**, Applicant requested that the President and Board of Trustees of the Village of Franklin Park (the "*Corporate Authorities*") support and consent to the filing of its application for a Class 6B Real Estate Tax Assessment Classification for the Property; and

**WHEREAS**, as part of the application submitted to the Village in support of the Class 6B Tax Assessment Classification, Applicant has provided an economic disclosure statement to the Village; and

**WHEREAS**, the adoption of a resolution by the Corporate Authorities is required and must be filed by Applicant with its application in order for the Property to obtain a Class 6B Tax Assessment Classification; and

**WHEREAS**, the Corporate Authorities find that the redevelopment contemplated for the Property will serve the residents of the Village and that without the Class 6B Tax Assessment Classification for the Property it will remain underdeveloped, continue to deteriorate, and exasperate blight in the area surrounding the Property; and

**WHEREAS**, to ensure the ongoing viability of the industrial base of the Village, the continuation and expansion of employment opportunities in the Village and to safeguard and further diversify the tax base of the Village, the Corporate Authorities have determined that it is necessary and in the best interests of the Village to approve the application by Applicant for a Class 6B Real Estate Tax Assessment Classification for the Property; and

**WHEREAS**, the Corporate Authorities hereby request that the President and Cook County Board of Commissioners of the County of Cook concur with the findings of the Village to authorize

the Class 6B Tax Assessment Classification for the Property.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** by the President and Board of Trustees of the Village of Franklin Park, Cook County, Illinois, as follows:

**Section 1.** That the above recitals and legislative findings are found to be true and correct and are hereby incorporated herein and made a part hereof, as if fully set forth in their entirety.

**Section 2.** Subject to the conditions set forth in Section 4 herein, the Corporate Authorities support and consent to the filing of an application for a Class 6B Tax Assessment Classification for the Property, which is legally described on Exhibit A, and find that without a Class 6B Tax Assessment Classification, the Property will remain underdeveloped, underutilized, and continue to deteriorate, which will not only hinder further new development efforts in the area surrounding the Property but will thwart the efforts of Applicant to undertake its proposed new facility and expansion of its industrial campus within the Village.

**Section 3.** The Corporate Authorities further find that the granting of the Class 6B Tax Assessment Classification is necessary for the industrial development to remain viable on the Property, which is the subject of this Resolution.

**Section 4.** That it is in the best interest of the Village to enter into the *Property Tax Assessment Classification Agreement*, a copy of which is attached hereto and made a part hereof as Exhibit B (the “*Agreement*”); and that the Agreement is hereby authorized and approved, with such necessary changes as determined by the Village President, with said changes and revisions therein contained being approved by execution and delivery of such Agreement by the Village President.



**Section 5.** The officials, officers, employees, and attorneys of the Village are hereby authorized to undertake actions on the part of the Village as contained in this Resolution and the Agreement to complete satisfaction of the provisions, terms or conditions stated therein.

**Section 6.** If any section, paragraph, clause, or provision of this Resolution shall be held invalid, the invalidity thereof shall not affect any other provision of this Resolution.

**Section 7.** This Resolution shall be in full force and effect upon the last to occur:

- i. its passage, approval and publication as provided by law; and
- ii. the execution by the Applicant and the Village of the Agreement as provided in this Resolution.
