WHEREAS, the Village of Franklin Park, Cook County, Illinois (the "*Village*") is a duly organized and existing municipal corporation created under the provisions of the laws of the State of Illinois and under the provisions of the Illinois Municipal Code, as from time to time supplemented and amended; and

WHEREAS, the Metropolitan Water Reclamation District of Greater Chicago is a unit of local government and body corporate and politic, organized, and existing under the laws of the State of Illinois; and

WHEREAS, Article VII, Section 10 of the Illinois Constitution of 1970 authorizes units of local government to enter into contract to exercise, combine or transfer any power or function not prohibited by law; and

WHEREAS, the Intergovernmental Cooperation Act, 5 ILCS 220/1 *et seq.*, (the "*Act*") authorizes units of local government to exercise jointly with any public agency of the State, including other units of local government, any power, privilege, or authority which may be exercised by a unit of local government individually, and to enter into contracts for the performance of governmental services, activities or undertakings; and

WHEREAS, the Village desires to construct over one thousand (1,000) square yards of rain gardens within the parkways of the Village streets located along Pacific Avenue for the public benefit of reducing flooding and providing green infrastructure in the general area; and

WHEREAS, it is the desire of the President and Board of Trustees of the Village of Franklin Park (the “*Corporate Authorities*”) to enter into a First Amendment to Intergovernmental Agreement between the Metropolitan Water Reclamation District of Greater Chicago and the Village of Franklin Park for the Design, Construction, Operation and Maintenance of the Pacific Avenue Industrial Corridor Green Infrastructure Program in Franklin Park, Illinois (the “*Amendment*”); and

WHEREAS, the Amendment provides for additional funding by the Metropolitan Water Reclamation District of Greater Chicago for the Village to undertake the infrastructure program.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the President and Board of Trustees of the Village of Franklin Park, Cook County, Illinois, as follows:

Section 1. That the above recitals and legislative findings are found to be true and correct and are hereby incorporated herein and made a part hereof, as if fully set forth in their entirety.

Section 2. The Amendment, a copy of which is attached hereto and made a part hereof as Exhibit A, is hereby approved in the form presented to this Village Board, with such necessary changes as may be authorized by the Village President, the execution thereof by the Village President to constitute the approval of the Corporate Authorities of the Village of any and all changes or revisions therein contained.

Section 3. The Village President and Village Clerk are hereby authorized and directed to execute and deliver the Amendment and any other document necessary to implement the provisions, terms and conditions thereof, as therein described.

WHEREAS, the Village of Franklin Park, Cook County, Illinois (the “*Village*”) is a duly organized and existing municipal corporation created under the provisions of the laws of the State of Illinois and under the provisions of the Illinois Municipal Code, as from time to time supplemented and amended; and

WHEREAS, the President and the Board of Trustees of the Village of Franklin Park (the “*Corporate Authorities*”) have heretofore exercised the power conferred on them pursuant to Chapter 11-13-1, *et seq.*, of the Illinois Municipal Code by adopting the Franklin Park Zoning Ordinance in 1974 (Ord. 7475 Z10), as amended from time to time; and

WHEREAS, a conditional use application, ZBA 22-15, has been submitted to the Village by Las Islas VIP LLC (the “*Applicant*”) to allow within the C-2-1 Community Shopping District the operation of a Drive-Through or Drive-Up (the “*Proposed Conditional Use*”) at a permitted restaurant on the property commonly known as 3560 River Road, Franklin Park, Illinois and as legally described and depicted on Exhibit A (the “*Property*”); and

WHEREAS, the Zoning Board of Appeals held a public hearing on September 7, 2022, on whether the Proposed Conditional Use should be approved, at which time all persons present were afforded an opportunity to be heard; and

WHEREAS, a public notice in the form required by law was given of said public hearing date; and

WHEREAS, the Zoning Board of Appeals has filed its findings of fact and recommendations that the Proposed Conditional Use be granted, and the Corporate Authorities have duly considered said findings of fact and recommendations; and

3. The Proposed Conditional Use, subject to the conditions set forth herein, will not impede the normal and orderly development of the surrounding property for uses permitted in the C-2-1 Community Shopping District;

4. The Proposed Conditional Use, subject to the conditions set forth herein, will not affect the exterior architectural appeal and functional plan of structures already constructed as to cause a substantial depreciation in property values within the neighborhood as the proposed plans will be an improvement upon the existing structure;
5. Adequate utilities, access roads, drainage and necessary facilities for the Proposed Conditional Use are already in place at the Property;
6. Ingress and egress for the Proposed Conditional Use, subject to the conditions set forth herein, shall minimally affect traffic congestion in the public streets; and
7. The Proposed Conditional Use shall, in all other respects, conform to the applicable regulations of the C-2-1 Community Shopping District, except as such regulations may, in each instance, be modified by the Board of Trustees pursuant to the recommendations of the Zoning Board of Appeals.

Section 4. A Conditional Use, subject to the conditions set forth below, is hereby granted and issued to Las Islas VIP LLC for the operation of a Drive-Thru or Drive-Up at a permitted restaurant in the C-2-1 Community Shopping District located at 3560 N. River Road, Franklin Park, Illinois, and as legally described and depicted on Exhibit A.

This conditional use permit is subject to the following conditions:

1. That the Applicant maintain the required eight-foot screening on the west property line;
2. That the Applicant install and maintain a “No Left Turn” sign on the northern egress of the Property onto River Road;
3. That the Conditional Use complies at all times with all other applicable codes, regulations, and ordinances of the Village of Franklin Park;

Section 8. This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect following its passage, approval and publication in pamphlet form as provided by law.
