IV. PRESENTATION: MATT ELMORE WITH ENERGY IMPACT ILLINOIS ON AN ENERGY REBATE PROGRAM

Matt Elmore from Energy Impact Illinois gave a presentation on the Energy Rebate Program. This program is funded by the Department of Energy but implemented by the Chicago Metropolitan Agency for Planning (CMAP). Most residential owners can qualify for this program. This program can save approximately \$400 to \$500 a year on energy costs and increase the value of home if you make these energy-saving upgrades

VII. STAFF REPORTS AND COMMENTS; DISCUSSION ON AGENDA ITEMS

- 1. Chief Witz explained what Item #8 on the Consent Agenda was all about. Chief Witz spoke about the Police Department providing traffic control over the weekend for the 5K Race; and he spoke about two narcotics search warrants executed by the Police Department
- 2. John Schneider spoke about meeting with the property owners who own the site where Kmart use to be and stated they are thinking about redeveloping it. Big Lots is one of the current leasers. Mr. Schneider explained the three 6b real estate tax assessment applications on the Consent Agenda and also spoke about the application put into CMAP to look at doing land use studies and traffic studies out in the Village's industrial area
- 3. Steve Scheffel spoke about the street improvement program that is underway. Mr. Scheffel spoke about the project the Village is working on with ComEd to install cable lines and electrical duct banks. The last item Mr. Scheffel spoke about was the "Safe Routes to School" project which will involve improvements to the walkways at 25th Avenue and Gage Street and 25th Avenue and Chestnut Street
- 4. Chief Iovinelli spoke about the Fire Department responding to a call on Washington Street. The Fire Department also responded to a fire in Elmwood Park on Sunday morning. Chief Iovinelli reported the first of the new fire engine's chassis and cabs will be at the fire station on Wednesday. Chief Iovinelli announced Thursday ISO (Insurance Services Office) will be coming out. ISO is a rating service that will rate the Village for its fire protection
- 5. Dennis Wagner spoke about the new AT&T contract signed earlier this year which is saving the Village approximately \$5,000 to \$6,000 per month and about the switch over to Verizon which is saving the Village approximately \$1,000 per month. Mr. Wagner reported the new antenna site up at the west water tower is fully operational and online. The Village's communication equipment has all been removed from the water tower. Mr. Wagner spoke about meeting with new vendors regarding a new phone system
